CONDITIONAL RELEASE OF PRISONER

THIS DAY the Acting Governor surrendered Millard Clay Thornhill, Kentucky State Penitentiary, Eddyville, Kentucky, to the United States Marshal for the Eastern District of Kentucky, for arraignment-trial in the case of United States of America v. Millard Clay Thornhill, on the 5th day of March, 1973, United States District Court, Covington, Kentucky, on condition that said prisoner be returned immediately after the proceedings to Henry E. Cowan, Superintendent of the aforesaid institution, and on further conditions that all expenses of this transfer be paid by the United States of America. In no event shall surrender of this prisoner be construed as a complete relinquishment of jurisdiction by this Commonwealth.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 73- 239-RELATING TO REORGANIZATION -HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET

WHEREAS, public officials must constantly seek improvements in the quality of state services and their administration and management; and

WHEREAS, the electorate has mandated a modernization of governmental organizations and delivery systems to improve services and minimize the costs thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Reorganization Staff has proposed certain modifications of the governmental structure to further the objectives of improved management and more effective services to the taxpaying public; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 72- 1167 has established the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET to include the Commission on Aging, Department of Child Welfare, Commission on Children and Youth, Department of Economic Security, Commission for Handicapped Children, Department of Health, Human Rights Commission, Department of Labor, Department of Mental Health, Office of Economic Opportunity, Department of Mines and Minerals, Bureau of Veterans Affairs, and Office of Youth Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Governor is responsible for, and empowered to provide overall executive direction to these agencies and coordinate their activities,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell H. Ford, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Sections 69 and 78, and by the power granted to me through Kentucky Revised Statutes Chapter 12, and in further pursuance to Executive Order 72- 1167 do hereby order and direct the following Reorganization effective March 2, 1973.

1. The Office of SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES is hereby created.
2. The SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall be a member of the Governor's Staff and shall serve as the Governor's chief assistant and executive officer in carrying out the Governor's responsibilities for overall direction and coordination of the agencies included in the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET.
3. The SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall recommend to the Governor desired reorganization affecting agencies in the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET and shall advise with the Governor on executive actions, legislative measures, and other steps that may be thought desirable to assure that the people of Kentucky will be well served by human resources programs.

FRIDAY, MARCH 2, 1973 (CONTINUED)

EXECUTIVE ORDER 73- 239-RELATING TO REORGANIZATION-HUMAN RESOURCES (CONTINUED)

4. The SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall perform such tasks as may be assigned by the Governor incidental to the Governor's powers and responsibilities with respect to the agencies included in the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET, and the SECRETARY shall, specifically, conduct comprehensive human resource planning, coordinate and provide overall direction for the planning of the activities and programs of the agencies included in the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET, and establish procedures for the study and evaluation of programs and activities and their management.

5. The SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall evaluate and pass upon all budget requests originated by the agencies included in the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET and shall be the primary representative of that CABINET in the budget review process conducted by the office for Policy and Management, Executive Department for Finance and Administration.

6. The SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall provide for the administration of any and all human resources programs not otherwise confined to a single agency for administration.

7. The SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall be responsible for overall direction and coordination of relations between the Commonwealth and the agencies of the Federal Government pertinent to the activities and programs of the agencies included in the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET.

8. The Office of SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall be filled by appointment of the Governor. The SECRETARY may, with approval of the Governor, appoint in manner prescribed by law such deputies, directors, assistants and/or other officers and employees as may be necessary for the performance of the SECRETARY'S duties, subject to appropriate budgetary review and control by the Executive Department for Finance and Administration and the Department of Personnel. The SECRETARY shall advise with the Governor on the appointment of Commissioners and other heads of agencies included in the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET.

9. The Office of the SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall include Comprehensive Health Planning and State Office of Economic Opportunity.

10. The Human Resources Coordinating Commission is abolished and terminated and its personnel, funds and other resources are hereby transferred to the SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES.

III. The SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES shall have access to the pertinent records and other information of the human resources agencies which he deems necessary for the fulfillment of his duties. All personnel of all agencies contained within the HUMAN RESOURCES CABINET are hereby directed to cooperate fully with the SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES in the achievement of the objectives of this Order.

12. The SECRETARY FOR HUMAN RESOURCES is authorized to accept and expend funds from any source, whether public or private, in support of the duties and responsibilities hereby vested in this Order.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 73-277-REORGANIZATION KENTUCKY MANPOWER COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the well-being and quality of life of Kentucky's citizens depends upon the opportunity for each to obtain meaningful employment at an adequate level of income; and

WHEREAS, the vigor of Kentucky's economy depends upon the availability of a trained and productive labor force; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interests of all citizens of the State that current and prospective manpower shortages be identified, and that persons whose employment status can be improved if they are trained to fill these vacancies are presented with an opportunity to participate in our expanding economy; and

WHEREAS, the State now provides a complex array of manpower training services through several separate agencies, and is also faced with the difficult task of providing leadership and coordination to public and private manpower service agencies, labor and industry in manpower services; and

WHEREAS, it has become evident that there is a need for an improved mechanism for providing coordination and leadership of manpower training and services;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority granted by the provision of KRS 12.025, I do hereby order and direct the following reorganization effective March 14, 1973.

KENTUCKY MANPOWER COUNCIL

Section 1. There is hereby created the Kentucky Manpower Council which shall advise the Governor and the Secretary for Human Resources in the development of a comprehensive manpower planning system, and in the preparation of state plans for manpower training and services.

Section 2. The Kentucky Manpower Council is hereby vested with the responsibility to:

A. Provided the Secretary for Human Resources with advice on the development, implementation, and operation of a statewide manpower planning program suitable for the needs of Kentucky which shall relate with the Co-operative Area Manpower Planning System of the Federal government.

B. Coordinate all manpower services and activities relating to the training of individuals for the purpose of improving or restoring employability and career development services.

C. Act as advisory committee on all manpower service programs and activities including supportive services delegated to the State by the Federal Government.

D. Act as advisory committee on all State originated or proposed manpower and related service programs.

E. Recommend policies, programs, and procedures to achieve better program efficiencies; prevent duplication and overlapping; and to meet the requirements of State manpower program goals.

F. Conduct a continuing review and analysis of manpower service programs and activities carried out under the State Comprehensive Manpower Plan.

G. Coordinate with and receive advice from Ancillary Manpower Councils.

H. Establish and maintain productive relationships with Mayors and staffs involved in Mayor's Manpower Area Councils.

I. Publish plans and reports on manpower activities in the State as appropriate and make a formal annual review of the State Comprehensive Plan and Programs.

J. Coordinate the compilation and analysis of data relating to the identification of manpower needs and establishment of program priorities.

K. Recommend allocation of such funds as may be granted or appropriated for the herein stated purposes.

Section 3. The membership of the Kentucky Manpower Council shall consist of the following:

A. As ex officio members, the executive heads of the following agencies of the Commonwealth or their regular designees: Commerce, Corrections, Child Welfare, Cooperative Extension Service, Economic Security, Education, Environmental Protection, Health, Labor, Mental Health, and Personnel.

B. Six representatives of client groups: Such as the aged, racial minorities, rural poor, urban poor, veterans, women and youth.

C. Seven representatives of labor, business, and local government with knowledge of the manpower and labor force needs of the Commonwealth in agriculture, construction, manufacturing, mining, public utilities, wholesale, retail trade, general services and organized labor.

Section 4. With the exception of those members named in Section 3, subsection A, the members of the Council shall serve for four years and until their successors are appointed, except for the original appointments which shall be for terms of office as follows:

Four members for terms expiring on December 31, 1973;

Four members for terms expiring on December 31, 1975.

SECTION 5. The Secretary for Human Resources shall serve as Chairman of the Council. The Council shall have authority to select other officers necessary to assure the attainment of the purposes, responsibilities and objectives as set forth in this Executive Order.

Section 6. The Chairman of the Kentucky Manpower Council shall provide a staff which will work under his supervision. The staff will include such personnel as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Executive Order, and will operate in accordance with official agreements between the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the U. S. Department of Labor regarding the Cooperative Area Manpower Planning System.

Section 7. Members of the Council shall serve without pay, but shall be reimbursed for necessary and actual expenses.

Section 8. The Council shall hold regular meetings at least quarterly and special meetings on call of the chairman.

Section 9. The Department and agency representatives of the Council shall comprise a Manpower Planning Task Force, whose duties will include the provision of technical planning support to the Kentucky Comprehensive Manpower Plan and other related planning functions.

Section 10. The Council shall utilize regional human Resources councils as Ancillary Manpower Councils throughout the state to insure local involvement in comprehensive manpower planning and delivery of manpower services. These regional councils shall be organized to conform with the development district multi-county areas. The structure and function of the regional councils shall be determined by the Kentucky Manpower Council and shall incorporate sufficient flexibility to permit planning, evaluation, and coordination under Manpower Revenue Sharing, or a Comprehensive Manpower Program. The Kentucky Manpower Council shall coordinate with regional councils planning activities, and review all actions to assure conformance with statewide policies and objectives.

Section 11. The Kentucky Manpower Council shall become operational upon appointment and the Kentucky Manpower Coordinating Committee is dissolved. All unresolved issues, functions, staff resources, funds and related matter of concern to the Kentucky Manpower Planning Committee are transferred to the Kentucky Manpower Council concurrent with the issuance.

Section 12. Nothing herein shall be construed to change the purpose or intent of any existing statute, nor shall it restrict the full exercise of authority or responsibility of departments, agencies, and officials in their proper performance of their legal responsibilities.

WHEREAS, public officials must constantly seek improvements in the quality of State services and their administration and management; and

WHEREAS, the electorate has mandated a modernization of governmental organizations and delivery systems to improve services and minimize the costs thereof; and

WHEREAS, the economic strength and well-being of the people of Kentucky are very closely tied to the transportation system available today and to the development of a coordinated transportation system of the future; and

WHEREAS, the magnitude and complexities of providing comprehensive transportation services strongly indicates the necessity for a single state transportation agency to assure cooperative leadership and a cooperative transportation effort among federal, state, and local officials; non-official agencies; and other groups active in transportation development programs and related activities; and

WHEREAS, the authority and responsibility for many programs necessary for the efficient and effective movement of people and goods for the citizens of the Commonwealth would otherwise remain in several agencies of state government; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Reorganization Staff has proposed certain modifications of the governmental structure to further the objectives of improved management and more effective services to the taxpaying public,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WENDELL H. FORD, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky by virtue of the authority vested in me by Sections 69 and 78 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and by the powers granted to me by Chapter 12 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, do hereby order and direct the following reorganization, effective March 16, 1973:

1. The DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, a new department of State Government, is hereby created. This Department shall be headed by the SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION which office is hereby created.

2. All functions, authority and responsibility now vested in the Department of Motor Transportation (KRS Chapters 138, 186, 189, 190 and 281) are hereby merged and consolidated within the Department of Transportation.

3. All functions, authority and responsibility now vested in the Department of Highways (KRS Chapters 175 through 180, 189 and related statutes) are hereby merged and consolidated within the Department of Transportation.

4. All functions, authority and responsibility now vested in the Department of Aeronautics (KRS Chapter 183) are hereby merged and consolidated within the Department of Transportation.

All functions, authority and responsibility of the Department of Public Safety as they relate to the issuance, revocation and suspension of operators licenses (KRS Chapter 186), boats and boating (KRS Chapter 235), financial responsibility (KRS Chapter 187), motor vehicle inspection administration (KRS Chapter 189), the fire marshals office relative to the transportation of Hazardous materials (KRS Chapters 227 and 234), and the Traffic Safety Coordinating Committee (KRS Chapter 17) are hereby merged and consolidated within the Department of Transportation.

7. The Secretary of The Department of Transportation shall have exclusive control and direction over the affairs of the Department of Transportation and he shall exercise all of the functions, authority and responsibility of the Departments of Motor Transportation, Highways, Aeronautics, Public Safety and Revenue hereinabove transferred to the Department of Transportation.

of Aeronautics and all long-range planning and policy recommendation functions, authority, and responsibility now contained in the Divisions of Planning and Research in the Department of Highways.

(b) The Division of Environmental Systems. The Division of Environmental Systems shall include, but not be limited to, all functions, authority, and responsibility now contained in the Division of Environmental Systems in the Department of Highways.

(c) The Division of Airports. The Division of Airports shall consist of all functions, authority, and responsibility now contained in the Airport Zoning Commission in the Department of Aeronautics.

(d) The Division of Mass Transit. The Division of Mass Transit shall be responsible for addressing the public transit needs of the citizens of the Commonwealth. Specifically, its functions shall include, but not be limited to, monitoring of developments in the public transit field and providing liaison and coordination with appropriate federal, state, regional, and local groups or organizational units concerning the mix of transportation alternatives in the Commonwealth. It is a responsibility of the Division of Mass Transit to participate in the State Transportation planning function.

(4) Division of Public Affairs. The Division of Public Affairs shall be headed by a Director who shall be responsible to the Secretary for the development and implementation of programs which are necessary to keep the public informed of the affairs of the Department.

(5) Division of Budgets. The Division of Budgets shall be headed by a Director who shall be responsible to the Secretary for the formulation and implementation of transportation programs and practices; for coordinating and reconciling these programs and practices with department developmental plans; for formulating budget requests; for monitoring the expenditure of all budgeted funds; and for advising the Secretary on financial matters relating to transportation programs.

(6) Division of Audit Review. The Division of Audit Review shall be headed by a Director who shall be responsible to the Secretary for insuring a proper audit of the receipt and expenditure of all funds by the Department.

B. Executive Office of Staff Services. The Executive Office of Staff Services shall be headed by an administrator with such authority and responsibility as delegated by the Secretary of the Department of transportation under the provisions of this Executive Order. The Administrator shall be directly responsible to the Secretary of Transportation and shall furnish administrative support directly to the Commissioner of Highways and the Commissioner of Vehicle Regulation as deemed necessary by each Commissioner.

C. Bureau of Highways. The Bureau of Highways shall be headed by a Commissioner with such authority and responsibility as delegated by the Secretary of the Department of Transportation under the provisions of this Executive Order. The Commissioner shall be directly responsible to the Secretary of Transportation and shall have direct access to the Administrator of Staff Services for administrative support.

D. Bureau of Vehicle Regulation. The Bureau of Vehicle Regulation shall be headed by a Commissioner with such authority and responsibility as delegated by the Secretary of the

Department of Transportation under the provisions of this Executive Order. The Commissioner shall be directly responsible to the Secretary of Transportation and shall have direct access to the Administrator of Staff Services for administrative support.

10. The Executive Office of Staff Services, created by this Executive Order as a function of the Department of Transportation, shall consist of the following organizational units which are hereby created:

(1) The Office of Personnel Management. The Office of Personnel Management shall be headed by an Executive Director who shall be responsible to the Administrator. The Office shall develop, formulate and implement programs of personnel and administrative management practices for the Department with the following subordinate divisions each headed by a Director who shall be responsible to the Executive Director.

(a) The Division of Personnel. The Division of Personnel shall be responsible for the formulation and implementation of programs and practices for the recruitment, training, and utilization of the personnel of the Department.

(b) The Division of Management Services. The Division of Management Services shall be responsible for formulation and implementation of programs, practices, and procedures of a management nature for the Department.

(c) The Division of Contract Compliance. The Division of Contract Compliance shall be responsible for contractor's wage and Equal Employment Opportunities, safety and E. E. O. vendor compliance practices.

(2) The Office of Administration and Operations. The Office of Administration and Operations shall be headed by an Executive Director who shall be responsible to the Administrator. The Office shall formulate and implement programs and practices for the proper receipt, management and disbursement of all funds received and disbursed by the Department with the following subordinate divisions each headed by a Director responsible to the Executive Director:

(a) The Division of Accounts. The Division of Accounts shall be responsible for the formulation and implementation of programs and practices with respect to the receipt, allocation, management and disbursement of all funds received by the Department.

(b) The Division of Service and Supply. The Division of Service and Supply shall be responsible for the determination of the needs and utilization practices of the Department with respect to office, engineering and laboratory supplies.

(c) The Division of Contract Procurement. The Division of Contract procurement shall be responsible for the negotiation of all contracts for goods and services which may be executed by the Department without competitive bidding, and shall advertise, receive bids, and do all other things necessary for the awarding of contracts required by law to be let by bids.

(d) The Division of Purchases. The Division of Purchases shall be responsible for the formulation and implementation of programs and practices for the purchase of supplies, equipment and materials required by the Department, consistent with the delegation of authority by the Executive Department for Finance and Administration.

(e) The Division of Real Property. The Division of Real Property shall be responsible for the determination of real property requirements, utilization practices, and maintenance with respect to real property required or owned by the Department other than such property required or owned for roadway purposes.

(f) The Division of Transportation Services. The Division of Transportation Services shall be responsible for state air transportation services, operation of the Capital City Airport and Motor pool operations for the Department.

(g) The Division of Toll Facilities. The Division of Toll Facilities shall be responsible for toll collection, the development of facilities on toll roads, and the development and implementation of programs and practices for the proper utilization of the toll system.

(3) The Office of General Counsel. The Office of General Counsel shall be headed by an Executive Director who shall be responsible to the Administrator for the formulation and implementation of programs and procedures of a legal nature relating to the functions of the Department and shall render legal opinions, offer legal advice and provide legal services to the Department with the following subordinate divisions each headed by a Director responsible to the Executive Director:

(a) The Division of Law. The Division of Law shall be responsible for the formulation and implementation of programs for administrative law, trials, appeals and contracts for the Department.

(b) The Division of Hearings. The Division of Hearings shall be responsible for the conduct of Public hearings on applications for operating authority, sale and transfer of existing authority, initial establishment of rates and schedules, changes in existing tariffs, and all public hearing proceedings of the Department.

(4) The Office of Computer Services. The Office of Computer Services shall be headed by an Executive Director who shall be responsible to the Administrator for the formulation and implementation of programs and practices to insure the full and efficient utilization of all computer facilities available to the Department with the following subordinate divisions each headed by a Director responsible to the Executive Director:

(a) The Division of Data Processing. The Division of Data Processing shall be responsible for the development of systems and operations to expedite the work of the Department.

(b) The Division of Administrative Information Systems. The Division of Administrative Information Systems shall be responsible for the development and maintenance of an administrative information system for the Department.

(c) The Division of Technical Computing. The Division of Technical Computing shall be responsible for the development and implementation of computer services which will provide maximum support for engineering processes within the Department.

11. Bureau of Highways. The Bureau of Highways shall consist of the following organizational units which are hereby created:

A. Office of the Commissioner. The office of the Commissioner shall be headed by the Commissioner of Highways who shall be responsible to the Secretary of Transportation for Administration of Highway construction, reconstruction and maintenance programs under authority conferred by the Secretary of Transportation.

B. Office of Deputy Commissioner for Rural and Municipal Aid. The Office of Deputy Commissioner for Rural and Municipal Aid shall be headed by a Deputy Commissioner who shall have such duties and shall perform such functions as may be assigned to him by the Commissioner of Highways and shall report directly to the Commissioner of Highways. The Deputy Commissioner shall be responsible for providing executive direction through the Assistant State Highway Engineer for Rural and Municipal Aid for the County Road Aid Program, the Rural Secondary Program and the Municipal Aid Program. He shall make program recommendations and progress reports to the Commissioner of Highways as well as reports outlining the status and operational difficulties of particular projects.

C. Office of Deputy Commissioner. The Deputy Commissioner shall be responsible to the Commissioner and perform such functions as may be assigned, including the responsibility which pertains to the Appalachian Program.

D. Office of State Highway Engineer. The Office of State Highway Engineer shall be headed by a professional engineer who shall be the technical advisor to the Commissioner of Highways and who, under the direction of the Commissioner, shall supervise all design, construction, and maintenance work of the Bureau and perform other duties such as are assigned to him by the Commissioner. The State Highway Engineer shall report to the Commissioner of Highways.

There shall be five subordinate offices headed by Assistant State Highway Engineers. In addition to such other responsibilities as may be assigned by the Commissioner of Highways or the State Highway Engineer, the heads of these offices shall have the following duties and perform the following functions:

E. Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Research and Planning. The Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Research and Planning shall be headed by an Assistant State Highway Engineer who shall be responsible to the State Highway Engineer and the Commissioner of Highways for duties and responsibilities outlined herein:

Formulate and implement research and development programs.

Serve as Bureau's research liaison representative.

Review and develop specifications and standards.

Formulate procedures and supervise the Bureau's Estimating function.

Develop and process the Federal Aid Highway Program.

Prepare and execute Federal Aid Project documents.

Prepare Bureau project authorization documents.

The Assistant State Highway Engineer for Research and Planning shall supervise the following subordinate divisions each headed by a director responsible to the Assistant Highway Engineer.

(1) The Division of Research. The Division of Research shall be responsible for development of design criteria for designing roadway plans and for construction of segments of the State Highway System.

(2) The Division of Planning. The Division of Planning shall be responsible for planning activities relating to the identification, evaluation, and quantification of the State Highway System and its needs.

F. Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Preconstruction. The Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Pre-Construction shall be headed by an Assistant State Highway Engineer who shall be responsible to the State Highway Engineer and the Commissioner of Highways for duties and responsibilities outlined herein:

Formulate and implement programs, practices, and procedures for the pre-construction phase of highway projects.

Monitor project status in pre-construction phase.

The Assistant State Highway Engineer for Pre-Construction shall supervise the following subordinate divisions each headed by a director responsible to the Assistant Highway Engineer:

(1) The Division of Design. The Division of Design shall be responsible for development of design criteria for designing roadway plans and for construction of segments of the State Highway System.

(2) The Division of Bridges. The Division of Bridges shall be responsible for the preparation of design criteria, plans-specifications and estimates for the construction, maintenance and repair of bridges and drainage structures on the State Highway System.

(3) The Division of Photogrammetry. The Division of Photogrammetry shall be responsible for developing criteria for photogrammetric processes, including aerial mosaics and planimetric maps of segments of the State Highway System.

(4) The Division of Right of Way. The Division of Right of Way shall be responsible for developing and implementing programs to acquire rights of way, property appraisals, and the relocation assistance program for the Department.

G. Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Construction. The Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Construction shall be headed by an Assistant State Highway Engineer who shall be responsible to the State Highway Engineer and the Commissioner of Highways for duties and responsibilities outlined herein.

Review and approve all policy and procedure documents and manuals on Construction and Materials Construction and materials functions.

Serve on Departmental Committees relating to the construction function as designated.

The Assistant State Highway Engineer for Construction shall supervise the following subordinate divisions each headed by a director responsible to the Assistant State Highway Engineer:

(1) The Division of Construction. The Division of Construction shall be responsible for activities relating to the construction phase of a project.

(2) The Division of Materials. The Division of Materials shall be responsible for activities relating to testing and acceptance of materials.

H. Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Operations. The Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Operations shall be headed by an Assistant State Highway Engineer who shall be responsible to the State Highway Engineer and the Commissioner of Highways for duties and responsibilities outlined herein:

Formulate and implement programs, policies, and procedures relating to the functions of maintenance and traffic control on the State Road System, and highway equipment needs and utilization.

The Assistant State Highway Engineer for Operations shall supervise the following subordinate divisions each headed by a director responsible to the Assistant State Highway Engineer:

(1) The Division of Maintenance. The Division of Maintenance shall be responsible for activities relating to maintenance functions on the State Road System.

(2) The Division of Equipment. The Division of Equipment shall be responsible for the determination of equipment requirements, utilization practices, and equipment maintenance requirements with respect to equipment required or owned by the Bureau.

(3) The Division of Traffic. The Division of Traffic shall be responsible for traffic operations including signs, signals, and markings on the State Road System.

I. Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Rural and Municipal Aid. The Office of Assistant State Highway Engineer for Rural and Municipal Aid shall be headed by an Assistant State Highway Engineer who shall be responsible to the State Highway Engineer, Deputy Commissioner of Highways for duties and responsibilities outlined herein:

Develop rural and municipal aid program recommendations.

Provide staff support services for the Deputy Commissioner for Rural and Municipal Aid.

Recommend and implement policy and procedures relating to Rural and Municipal aid programs.

Assist in implementing approved rural and municipal aid programs.

The Assistant State Highway Engineer for Rural and Municipal Aid shall supervise the following subordinate division:

(1) The Division of Rural and Municipal Aid. The Division of Rural and Municipal Aid shall be headed by a Director responsible to the State Highway Engineer and Deputy Commissioner for Rural and Municipal Aid through the Assistant State Highway Engineer for Rural and Municipal Aid on matters relating to the development and implementation of county aid road programs, rural secondary road programs and municipal aid road programs.

J. Highway District Offices. District Offices are hereby established at the following locations to serve various geographic areas of the Commonwealth and each District shall be comprised of the counties indicated herein with headquarters at the stated location.

The District Office shall be headed by a District Engineer who shall be responsible to the State Highway Engineer and the Commissioner of Highways in designated field areas for the duties and responsibilities listed herein:

12. The Bureau of Vehicle Regulation shall consist of the following organizational units which are hereby created.

A. Office of the Commissioner. The Office of the Commissioner shall be headed by the Commissioner of Vehicle Regulation who shall be responsible to the Secretary of Transportation for administration of the functions herein transferred to the Bureau of Vehicle Regulation under Authority conferred by the Secretary of Transportation.

B. Office of Deputy Commissioner. The Commissioner shall appoint not more than two Deputy Commissioners who shall be directly responsible to him. The Deputy Commissioner(s) shall have such duties and perform such functions as may be assigned by the Commissioner.

C. Divisions of Bureau of Motor Vehicle Regulation. The Bureau of Motor Vehicle Regulation shall consist of six Divisions, each Division headed by a Director directly responsible to the Commissioner. In addition to such other responsibilities as may be assigned by the Commissioner, the Directors shall have the following duties and perform the following functions:

(1) Division of Motor Carriers. The Division of Motor Carriers shall be responsible for all matters concerning tariffs, operating authority, vehicular authority and special permits.

(2) Division of Motor Vehicle Tax. The Division of Motor Vehicle Tax shall be responsible for all matters concerning motor vehicle registration, collection of motor fuel use tax from motor carriers and the administration of proportional registration of motor carriers.

(3) Division of Drivers License. The Division of Drivers License shall be responsible for the issuance and control of all drivers license matters, administrative procedures related to tests for alcohol content in the blood, driver improvement, testing for the issuance of drivers license, and issuance of boat licenses.

(4) Division of Highway Enforcement. The Division of Highway Enforcement shall be responsible for enforcing all laws as they pertain to the operation of motor vehicles upon the highways, including the transportation of hazardous materials.

(5) Division of Water Enforcement. The Division of Water Enforcement shall be responsible for enforcing all laws as they pertain to the operation of boats upon the waterways of this state.

(6) Division of Inspections. The Division of Inspections shall be responsible for the administration of all laws pertaining to Motor Vehicle Dealers, Mobile Home Dealers, motor vehicle inspection and junkyards.

13. The Commissioner of the Executive Department for Finance and Administration and Administration and the Commissioner of the Department of Personnel shall take all necessary and required action to effect the transfer to the Secretary of the Department of Transportation all funds, personnel (including support personnel), equipment, outstanding obligations and any and all other resources for the purpose of carrying out the functions, authority and responsibility now vested in the Department of Transportation in accordance with the terms of this Order.
