John Roberts, 1st Lt. Co. I, 48th Va. Inf.

C.S.A. Enlisted Mar. 1, 1862 in Washing-
ton Co. Elected Lieut. Apr. 21, 1862.

Wounded at the battle of Chancell-
orsville, May 3, 1863 by reason of which
his leg was amputated in field hospital.

A Certificate issued by the Board
of Examiners at Abingdon, Va. Nov. 29, 1864
declares him incapable of performing
duty in the field in consequence of
amputation of the left thigh. Detail-
ed as Enr. officer Washington, Co.

Company Roll for Nov & Dec. 1864
shows him absent at home wounded. No
later record found.

W. F. Hagy (William F) Pvt. Co. I, 48th
Va. Inf. C.S.A. Enlisted Feb. 19, 1863 in
Washington, Co. Captured May 12, 1864
near Spottsylvania C.H. Paroled at
Elmira, N. Y. Oct. 11, 1864. Received at
Venus Point, Savannah River Nov. 15, 1864
No later record found.

D. W. Price (David W) Pvt. of Cos.
B, E & G, 48th Va. Inf. C.S.A. (not
found as of Co. C) Enlisted June 20,
1861 at Abingdon.

Latest record found shows him ad-
mitted to Genl. Hosp. No. 18, Richmond,
Va. May 7 and returned to duty June
4, 1863.

The Rolls of Cos B, C, D on file
in this office, only partly cover the
period from July 1, 1861 to Dec. 31,
1864; but the name John H. (or Halep)
Grace has not been found on these
rolls.

There is one Caleb H. Grace, Pvt.
Co. B, 48th Va. Inf. C.S.A. who enlisted
June 20, 1861 at Abingdon, was captured
near Spottsylvania C.H. May 12, 1864;
was transferred from Point Lockout,
Md to Elmira, N. Y. July 30, 1864, where
he died of Pneumonia Feb. 17, 1865.
