I, John H. Yancey S.W.
am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Brewer in the County of Campbell
in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Va, in the war between
the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of
Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear
that I was a member of Company D 31st Virginia Regiment
in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the
benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States,
and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and fam-
ily. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:

The material facts to be proven in the pension claim, under the laws of the State of Kentucky, are as follows:

- 1. Service in army.
- 2. Present Disability.
- 3. Indigency.
- 4. How you got out of the Army.
- 5. Character as a Soldier and Citizen.
- 6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filled out.

- 1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
- 2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
- 3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
- 4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.
- 5. May be proven by comrades and citizens.

the County atty A M Caldwell being present, the
Court find that the application was filed at the
preceding term of court in proper form and verified
Applicant testifies that he was born in Albemarle
County Virginia 1830, enlisted in Confederate Army
June 1 1861 and in Company "G" Hansborough's batt
-allion Captain of Company M Berry Colonel Higgin
both in 25 Virginia and John S Hoffman 3rd
Virginia, got out of the army June 17 1865 by being
released as prisoner at Fort Delaware, that he served
during the entire war except when in prison, that he has lived in
Campbell County Kentucky since 1867. Consequently, that he
is 83 years of age has no property either real or personal
and is not physically able to work, nor has he any contact
with any one for his support. The written evidence of his
Army Record he attaches herewith as part hereof. Doctor
J. M. Robertson testifies that general debility incident
to his advanced age, muscular atrophication & prevents him
from earning a living Jacob Sellers and Frank Witte
who live at Brent Campbell County Kentucky testify that
they have known John H. Jancey as a resident of Brent Cam
-pbell County Ky for twenty years that he is unable to do manual labor
that in the merits of his claim they do not recommend the granting
of the application for pension
