

Soldier's Application for Pension

I, James E. Albritten

am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Murray in the County of Calloway

in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Kentucky, in the war between

the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear

that I was a member of Company E 7th Kentucky Cavalry

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the

benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States,

and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and fam-

ily. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:

In what County, State and year were you born?

The material facts to be proven in the pension claim, under the laws of the State of Kentucky, are as follows:

1. Service in army.
2. Present Disability.
3. Indigency.
4. How you got out of the Army.
5. Character as a Soldier and Citizen.
6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filled out.

1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.
5. May be proven by comrades and citizens.

The name James E. Albritton has not been found on the rolls, on file in this office, of any company of the 7th Kentucky Cavalry or Infantry, Confederate States Army.

The records show, however, that one James E. Allbritten, 1st sergeant, Captain Bolen's Independent Company Kentucky Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted November 4, 1861 (also shown as November 1, 1862, and was present with that company on December 31, 1863, date of last roll on file. Nothing has been found of record to establish a connection between the last named company and the 7th Kentucky, Confederate States Army.

The records of prisoners of war show that one J. E. Albritten, sergeant, Company E, 7th Kentucky, --, was captured April 2, 1865, at Selma, Alabama, final disposition not shown, and that one James Albritton, sergeant, Company E, 3d and 7th Kentucky Volunteers (a resident of Calloway County, Kentucky), was paroled May 16, 1865, at Columbus, Mississippi.


Dear Sir:
