the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear

that I was a member of Co. E. - J. D. Sumas Capt. 5th Term

Reg. Vol. = W. E. Travis Col

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the

benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States,

and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and family.

- 1. Service in army.
- 2. Present Disability.
- 3. Indigency.
- 4. How you got out of the Army.
- 5. Character as a Soldier and Citizen.
- 6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filled out.

- 1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
- 2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
- 3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
- 4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.
- 5. May be proven by comrades and citizens.





Graves County Court. Regular Term, Monday, Sept. 16, 1912.

In the matter of application for pension of Geo. W. Brown, whose post office address is Lynville, Kentucky, R. F. D. No. 2, the court makes the following report of findings, viz: That the applicant is 70 years of age; that he has been a resident of this County and State all his life; that he has no property except personal to the amount of about \$150.; that his wife has no property; that he has no income nor arrangement for support; and that on account of his advanced age and infirmities he is not able to earn a reasonable support for himself; and that he does not now and has never received a pension from any State or Government. Then came W. S. Cook, whose address is Mayfield, Kentucky, and L. C. Brown whose address is Boydsville, Kentucky, who witnesses herein, who after having been sworn testified as follows: That the applicant is a resident of this County and State; that he owns personal property worth \$150.; that he has no income or support; that he is an invalid and confined to his room, and that he is in need of support.

Wherefore in view of the foregoing facts it is the judgment of the court that said applicant should be granted a pension and the court so recommends.
