# Questions for Applicant

Mrs. Alice A. Beall of said State and County, desiring to avail herself of the pension allowed to Indigent Widows of Soldiers, General Assembly, approved March 11, 1912, hereby submits her proofs, and after being duly sworn true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your full name and where do you reside? (Give State, County and Postoffice.)  
Alice Amanda Beall - In Nebron Boone County, Kentucky
2. How long and since when have you been a resident of this State? All my life - since 1849
3. When and where were you born and what was your maiden name? Born in Boone County, Kentucky, April 5<sup>th</sup> 1849. Maiden name Alice A. Hartman
4. When and where was your husband born—state his full name, and where were you and he married, and who performed the marriage ceremony. (If possible, attach certified copy marriage license in every case.)  
David Beall born October 28<sup>th</sup> 1842 - Married in Hamilton Ohio December 7<sup>th</sup> 1867 by Rev. J. Steck
5. When and where and in what Company and Regiment did your husband enlist or serve during the war between the States? In August 1862 - In Co. "B." 6<sup>th</sup> Confederate Battalion Capt. Vaughn
6. How long did your husband serve in said Company and Regiment? until the close of the war
7. When and where did your husband's Company and Regiment surrender? at Mt. Sterling Kentucky on May 1<sup>st</sup> 1865
8. Was your husband present at the time and place when his Company and Regiment surrendered? yes
9. If not with his command at surrender, state clearly and specifically where he was, when he left command, for what cause and by what authority?
10. When and where did your husband die? In Boone County, Kentucky June 17<sup>th</sup> 1909
11. At the time of your husband's death, were you living with him as his lawful wife? yes
12. Have you married since the death of your soldier husband? No
13. What property, real or personal, or income do you have or possess, and its gross value? one town lot - value \$700.00
14. Have you a family? If so, who compose such family? yes - three children all of age and living to themselves - no family dependent upon me
15. Name some friend, giving his name and postoffice address, who will be willing to have us write to him about your case if necessary... Dr. Frank Z. Sayre - Nebron, Kentucky

# Questions for Witnesses

Charles Helms, of said State and County, having been presented as a witness in support of the application of Mrs. Alice A. Beall for a pension under Confederate Pension Law, approved March 11, 1912, after being duly sworn, true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? Charles Helms  
Burlington, Kentucky, P. O. No. 3.
2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. Alice A. Beall - yes.
- If so, how long have you known her? all her life.
3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? Resides in Hebron in Boone County, Kentucky - Has resided in Boone County, Ky. all her life.
4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? yes.
5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage? no.
6. How long did you know him? over fifty years.
7. When and where did David Beall enlist in the war between the States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this? In August 1862 at Lebanon County Virginia - Co "B" 6th Confederate Battalion - was with him.
8. Were you a member of the same Company and Regiment at the close of the war? yes.
9. How long did he perform regular military duty? until close of war.
10. When and where was his Company and Regiment surrendered? at Mt. Sterling, Kentucky  
May 1st 1865.
11. Were you with the command when it surrendered? yes.
12. Was David Beall, the husband of applicant, present? yes.
13. If not present, where was he?
14. When and where did he leave his command?  
For what cause?  
By whose authority did he leave?
- How do you know all this? (State fully and clearly.)
15. When and where did David Beall die? June 17th 1909 in Boone County, Kentucky.
16. Where did he reside at his death, and how long had he been a resident of Kentucky at his death? Resided in Boone County all his life.
17. Do you know of your own knowledge that applicant is the lawful widow of David Beall? yes.

18. Has she remained unmarried since her soldier husband's death, and is she now his widow? *yes... yes.*

19. What property, effects or income has the applicant, if any, and how do you know this of your own knowledge?

*Do not know of anything except her house*

Has applicant conveyed any property, in the last two years or given any away, if so, what was it, and to whom?

*Do not know about that*

NOTE.—Let the witness who can answer the greatest number of the questions do so; then let the other witness state in the space below how much of the testimony of the first witness he concurs in, and whether or not he can answer any of the questions not answered by the first witness. *Witness Bruce Henry states that he concurs in the answer of witness Helen to Questions 2-3-4-5-6-7 (except as to date & place of enlisting - states David Beall was in his company) 15-16-17-18-19 and states he was captured before close of the war and does not know about the surrender at Mt Sterling, Ky.*

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
- 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
- 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
- 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
- 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
- 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

**NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.**

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.

The Application of Alice Amanda Beall for Confederate Pension having been filed in duplicate in open Court on the 3rd day of June, 1912, which was regular County Court day and the County Attorney N. E. Riddell being present, and the matter coming on for hearing and the Court being advised finds that Alice Amanda Beall is the widow of David Beall deceased, that she was married to said David Beall in 1867 at Hamilton, Ohio - that she is sixty-three years old and has resided in Boone County, Kentucky all her life - that she is now the widow of said David Beall, that she owns a house and lot in Hebron, Boone County, Ky., valued at about \$700.00 and that when she can rent this property she derives an income of \$48.00 per year from it. This is all the property she owns and she has no other income and is not able to earn a living by manual labor. Her husband David Beall served throughout the war as a Confederate soldier.

The Court is of the opinion that this claim is meritorious and should be allowed.

Dear Sir:-

I am just in receipt of the August (1922) pension check made payable to Mrs. Alice A. Beall, the certificate of death showing that Mrs. Beall died on Aug. 15th, and the copy of the Order of the Court appointing J. C. Hankins Administrator of the estate. As no letter accompanied these papers I am writing you what disposition should be made of them, as I do not know the post office of J. C. Hankins.

The Administrator can endorse the enclosed check and get the money on it and use it as he would any other estate left by the deceased.

I am also enclosing a voucher for the balance due up to and including the date of death, amounting to \$6.00, which if he will execute and return at once can be paid before the end of this month; otherwise it will have to await the next payment of pension, which is in February.
