FULL AND FREE PARDON

The Governor granted unto JOHN D. COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE.

The Governor commuted the sentence of SAM CASSITY from four to two years in the Reformatory. He having been convicted in Rowan Circuit Court, June term, 1932, for "Manslaughter". It appears that the defendant resided in West Virginia, and was visiting in Kentucky at time of trouble; that he plead self defense; that clemency is asked by 8 of the jury; by 97 of his neighbors in West Va., many of them being officers

in said State; by his wife and fourteen children who need his support; Circuit Judge H R Prewitt, Commth's Atty. W C Hamilton and by the widow of the deceased party.

COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE

The Governor commuted the sentence of PAUL LANEY from 15 to 8 years in the Reformatory, he having been convicted in Campbell Circuit Court, Feb. term, 1930, for "Voluntary manslaughter". COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE

COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE

C P Stephens, Ex-Commth's Atty., by Hon C B Wheeler, the trial judge, and by several county and city officials, and it appears that each of them has small children who need their mothers, and that each has served more than a year of her sentence.
