GOVERNOR ABSENT FROM THE STATE.

Hon. H. H. Holeman, Secretary to the Governor, having been informed by Governor Ruby Laffoon that he had passed out of the State of Kentucky at Twelve O'clock, midnight, on Tuesday February 5th., 1935, and the Secretary, H. H. Holeman, having notified Lieutenant Governor A. B. Chandler of the said absence of Governor Laffoon from the State, said Chandler this day, at nine o'clock, A. M., appeared and assumed the duties of the office of Governor, as provided for by law, and caused the following orders to be entered in the Journal, viz:

GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION

SPECIAL SESSION

LEGISLATURE

ACTING GOVERNOR, A. B. CHANDLER, THIS DAY ISSUED THE FOLLOWING PROCLAMATION, WHICH IS NOW ENTERED OF RECORD, AND IS IN WORDS AND FIGURES AS FOLLOWS:

"PROCLAMATION"

"TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
"THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

"Whereas, the people of the Commonwealth of Kentucky have indicated in no uncertain terms their desire to have an opportunity to select the nominees for State offices in State-wide primaries, and

"Whereas, the right of the people to have primaries is a fundamental one and ought not to be denied,

"Therefore, in order to insure to the people the restoration of their right to select the party nominees for all State offices at primaries, and in accordance with the power vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky to convene the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky in extraordinary Session, I, as Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do issue this, my proclamation convening the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky in extraordinary session at the seat of government at Frankfort, Kentucky, at twelve o'clock, noon, on Friday February 8, 1935, for the sole purpose of considering the following subject:

(1) To enact a compulsory primary law for the selection of all party nominees for all State offices at State-wide primaries.

"You will therefore in accordance with this proclamation assemble in said extraordinary session at the seat of government at Frankfort, Kentucky, on the day and date above written, to consider the subject herein mentioned, and only said subject.

"Given under my hand at 10:30 o'clock, A. M., this the 6th. day of February, 1935.

PROCLAMATION

Hon. Ruby Laffoon, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, this day issued the following proclamation, which is ordered to be spread upon the Executive Journal, and is, in words and figures, as follows:

"TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

"PROCLAMATION.

"Whereas, on the 6th day of February, 1935, and in the absence of the Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky at Washington, D. C., A. B. Chandler, Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky while acting as Governor, did issue a proclamation convening the General Assembly in extraordinary session at the seat of government at Frankfort, Kentucky, at twelve o'clock noon on Friday, February 8, 1935, for the sole purpose of considering the following subject:

"(1) To enact a compulsory primary law for the selection of all party nominees for all state offices at State-wide primaries."

"And, Whereas, such action on the part of said A. B. Chandler, acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, was and is null and void, no extraordinary occasion having arisen for the assembling of the General Assembly within the meaning of section 80 of the Constitution of Kentucky,

"And, Whereas, the occasion for the exercise of the authority vested in A. B. Chandler, Lieutenant Governor, while acting as Governor, by section 80 of the Constitution, has not arisen,

"And, Whereas, the purpose of the proclamation issued by A. B. Chandler, acting as Governor, was to serve the interests of certain selfish politicians instead of the best interests of the Commonwealth,

"And, Whereas, the people of the Commonwealth of Kentucky have been burdened with the accumulated cost of long and repeated sessions of the General Assembly, brought about by the economic stress of the Commonwealth,

"And, Whereas, the said General Assembly was recently in session in the year 1934, and had before it and fully considered the subject mentioned in the proclamation of A. B. Chandler, Lieutenant Governor, while acting as Governor, and after such full consideration, refused to legislate upon it,

"And, Whereas, the Governor of the Commonwealth is empowered by law to revoke, rescind and annul the proclamation issued by the Lieutenant Governor, while acting as Governor, which proclamation was for calling a convention of the General Assembly in extraordinary session for the purpose set out above,

"NOW, THEREFORE, in order to keep down the unnecessary expense incurred by a convention of the General Assembly in extraordinary session, which it is sought to cast on the citizens of this Commonwealth, I, Ruby Laffoon, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby revoke, rescind and annul the said proclamation of A. B. Chandler, Lieutenant Governor, while acting as Governor, which is above referred to, and do hereby request, enjoin and direct the members of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky that they forbear^{to} and do not meet at the seat of Government at twelve o'clock noon on Friday, February 8, 1935, in pursuance of the call of A. B. Chandler, Lieutenant Governor, while acting as Governor, on the 6th day of February 1935, at ten-thirty o'clock A. M.

EXECUTIVE ORDER.

REVOCAION OF EXTRADITION

JOHN T. MURPHY.

Governor Ruby Laffoon this day issued the following Executive Order, relative to the issual of an EXTRADITION WARRANT for John T Murphy, at the request of Gov. Martin L. Davey, Governor of the State of Ohio, which is here entered on the Executive Journal, and is in words and figures as follows, viz:

"WHEREAS, the Hon. Martin L. Davey, Governor of the State of Ohio, did, on the sixth day of February, 1935, issue his requisition upon the Governor of Kentucky for the extradition and return from Kentucky to the said State of Ohio Senator John T. Murphy."

"Said requisition is in words and figures as follows:

"WHEREAS, John T. Murphy has been charged by indictment with committing the crime of Uttering Forged Instrument within the County of Hamilton in this State, and has, by a requisition of this date, been demanded of the Governor of the State of Kentucky as a fugitive from justice."

"Said requisition was signed by Hon. Martin L. Davey, Governor of Ohio, duly attested by the Secretary of State of the State of Ohio; and,"

"WHEREAS, The Hon. A B Chandler, Lieutenant-Governor of Kentucky, as Acting Governor of Kentucky by reason of the absence of the undersigned Governor of Kentucky from the State, did on said date honor said requisition for the return to the said State of Ohio and Hamilton County thereof said Senator John T. Murphy by duly signing and executing an extradition, addressed to the sheriffs and constables of Kentucky, directing and commanding the apprehension and arrest of the said John T. Murphy and to bring him before some Circuit Judge of this Commonwealth that the said Circuit Judge may proceed by proper and legal testimony to inquire into the matter so far as should be necessary to ascertain his identity, and if he be the person mentioned in the extradition warrant, that the said Judge may order him to be delivered up to the duly authorized and appointed agent of the State of Ohio to receive and convey the said fugitive to said State to be dealt with according to law; and,"

(FEBRUARY 9, 1935.)

"WHEREAS, the said John T. Murphy has this day, through his duly constituted and appointed Attorneys, agents and representatives, applied to the undersigned Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky for a revocation of the extradition papers issued by Lieutenant-Governor A. B. Chandler, Acting Governor of Kentucky; and,"

"WHEREAS, the undersigned Governor of Kentucky refused to honor a requisition issued by the Hon. George White, then Governor of Ohio, on the eighteenth day of January, 1934, for the extradition of the said John T. Murphy from the State of Kentucky to the State of Ohio, said requisition being based upon the same charge and made upon the identical indictment as the basis of the requisition now in question; the undersigned Governor of Kentucky is of the opinion that a refusal to revoke the extradition of the said Senator John T. Murphy from Kentucky to the State of Ohio would be inconsistent with his former action regarding this matter, and upon due consideration of the case is of the opinion that Acting-Governor A. B. Chandler acted improvidently under the circumstances, and the extradition of the said Senator John T. Murphy should not have been granted by him:"

"NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky doth hereby and now revoke the order of extradition from the State of Kentucky to the State of Ohio of the said Senator John T. Murphy, granted on the 6th day of February, 1935, by Lieutenant-Governor A. B. Chandler, Acting-Governor of Kentucky; and the same is hereby REVOKED, SET ASIDE AND HELD FOR NAUGHT."

"All public officers, including all peace officers of every character and designated name, will take due notice of this order and govern themselves accordingly."

"DONE AT FRANKFORT, KENTUCKY, this, the ninth day of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and in the year of this Commonwealth the one hundred and forty-third."

PROCLAMATION--NATIONAL INDUSTRIAL RECOVERY ACT.

WHEREAS: On the 5th. day of February, 1935, Governor Ruby Laffoon issued a Proclamation relating to the "NATIONAL INDUSTRIAL RECOVERY ACT", said Proclamation is now entered of record in the Executive Journal, and is in words and figures as follows, viz:-

"P R O C L A M A T I O N".

"WHEREAS,- the Congress of the United States has enacted the National Industrial Act providing thereunder for Codes of Fair Competition for trades and industries which are now in effect throughout our Nation insuring orderly industrial rehabilitation; the stabilization of employment; the maintenance of fair wages and working hours for labor; the promotion of sound economic conditions and providing for social stability; and,

"WHEREAS,-the President of the United States has issued Executive Order, No.6646, requiring of Government contracts and contracts involving the use of Government funds a Certificate of Code Compliance; and,

"WHEREAS,- in furtherance of the National Industrial Recovery Act and compliance of the Codes of Fair Competition thereof and in conformity with the President's Executive Order, No.6646, I have this day issued an Executive Order requiring all Executive Departments, independent establishments and other agencies and instrumentalities of the Commonwealth of Kentucky to secure Certificate of Code Compliance in State contracts and in contracts involving the use of State funds. I hereby respectfully call upon all Municipalities and Counties and independent agencies thereof to require, as per my Executive Order, of all bidders and contractors and dealers in the purchase of goods and materials and/or contracts otherwise a Certificate of Code Compliance certifying compliance with each approved NRA Code of Fair Competition to which the bidder or contractor or dealer is subject."

EXECUTIVE ORDER--NATIONAL RECOVERY ADMINISTRATION.

WHEREAS: On the 5th day of February, 1935, Governor Ruby Laffoon issued an Executive Order, relating to STATE CONTRACTS AND CONTRACTS INVOLVING THE USE OF STATE FUNDS, which Order is now entered of record in the Executive Journal, and is in words and figures as follows, viz:-

"E X E C U T I V E O R D E R."

"STATE CONTRACTS AND CONTRACTS INVOLVING THE USE OF"

"STATE FUNDS."

"By virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, it is hereby ordered that:"

1. (a) "All invitations to bidders hereafter promulgated by or in behalf of any Executive Department or independent establishment or other agency or instrumentality of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, shall contain a provision to the effect that no bid will be considered unless it includes or is accompanied by a certificate duly executed by the bidder stating that the bidder is complying with and will continue to comply with each approved Code of Fair Competition of the National Recovery Administration to which he is subject, and if engaged in any trade or industry for which there is no approved Code of Fair Competition, then stating that as to such trade or industry he has become a party to and is complying with and will continue to comply with an agreement with the President under Section 4 (a) of the National Industrial Recovery Act."

(b) "No bid which does not comply with the foregoing requirements shall be considered or accepted."

(c) "All contracts and purchase orders authorized by any agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky shall contain a provision to the effect that the party or parties awarded any such contract or purchase order shall comply with each approved code of fair competition to which it is subject and if engaged in any trade or industry for which there is no approved code of fair competition, then, as to such trade or industry, with an agreement with the President as aforesaid; and that the Commonwealth of

Kentucky shall have the right to cancel any contract for failure to comply with such provision and make open market purchases or have the work called for by the contract otherwise performed, at the expense of the contractor."

(d) "No agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and no State contractor or supplier shall hereafter accept or purchase for the performance of any contract or purchase order or enter into any subcontracts for any articles, materials, or supplies, in whole or in part produced or furnished by any person who shall not have certified that he is complying with and will continue to comply with each code of fair competition which relates to such articles, materials, or supplies, or in case there is no approved code for the whole or any portion thereof, then, to that extent, with an agreement with the President as aforesaid."

2. "Whenever a dispute shall arise between any agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and any bidder, contractor, supplier, or other person as to compliance with any code of fair competition or with an agreement with the President as aforesaid in connection with any proposal, bid, contract, subcontract, or purchase order mentioned herein, the National Industrial Recovery Administration, shall decide such dispute and such decision shall be final and conclusive."
