

COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE.

The Governor commuted the two year sentence of RICHARD STRATENBERGER in Shelby Circuit Court, May term, 1934, for "robbery", to one year in State Reformatory. Clemency being recommended by W M Hannah, father of the aggrieved parties, and by the Circuit Judge, Commth's. Atty., County Atty., and County Judge.

COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE.

The Governor commuted the four year term of PETE WOTIER, in Fayette Circuit Court, Dec. term, 1932, for "conspiracy, etc.", to three years in the Reformatory. Executive clemency being recommended by S E Alexander, an aggrieved party, eight members of the jury, and for reasons fully set out in executive herein.

FULL AND FREE PARDON.

The Governor granted unto WILLIE STREET a full and free pardon of the judgment of the Graves Circuit Court, June term, 1934, for a two year term in the State Penitentiary at Eddyville, Ky., for "manslaughter". This pardon is asked for and recommended by a number of the most outstanding citizens of Mayfield and Graves County, and by several of the County officials, and Commth's Atty F B Martin does not desire to protest the granting of a pardon.

FULL AND FREE PARDON.

The Governor granted unto FLOYD MILLER a full and free pardon of a judgment of Rockcastle Circuit Court, Sep. term, 1930, for "false entry on books of a Bank", and fixing the punishment at two terms of six and seven years, to run concurrently, in the State Reformatory. Said Miller's said sentences having been commuted by the Governor on Feb. 22, 1934, to a total of four years and six months, and he released on parole. It appears that said Miller has conducted himself as a good and useful citizen since his release, and he is now deemed worthy of pardon and restoration to citizenship for reasons set forth in the record asking for commutation.

PARDON OF INDICTMENT.

The Governor remitted the penalty and pardon the offense as alleged in the Indictment against J. M. CRAIG, in Garrard Circuit Court, for "carrying concealed a deadly weapon", to wit: a pistol, and forever acquits, releases and discharges the said Craig from said Indictment. Clemency is asked in Petition signed by 89 citizens of Garrard County, including many of the present officials and ex-officials of Said County, and many of whom visited the Governor in person.


