

EXECUTIVE ORDER

REWARD.

Governor Ruby Laffoon this day filed an executive order, which is ordered to be entered on the Executive Journal, and which order is in words and figures as follows:

"EXECUTIVE ORDER"

The Governor this day issued an executive order touching the matter of offering a reward for the assassin or assassins of Hon. Elmon Middleton, County Attorney of Harlan County, and in which order the Governor embraced, as a part thereof, an interview given by him to the Associated Press representatives on this, the 5th day of September, 1935, relating to said matter; also incorporated as a part thereof an open letter written by said Elmon Middleton, under date of August 29, 1935; and also incorporated as a part thereof a "duly certified Circuit Court order, made and entered by Judge James M. Gilbert, Judge of the Harlan Circuit Court, on the fourteenth day of September, 1934", and thereupon the Governor stated as follows, in said Executive order, viz:

"Now as Governor of Kentucky, I call upon every officer of the State and upon every citizen thereof to inform me of any fact connected with this crime that all facts may be assembled in the hands of constituted authority for investigation in an effort to maintain the dignity of the law of Kentucky.

"Yes, I shall offer a reward of \$1000.00 (One thousand dollars) for the arrest and conviction of the guilty party or parties, and said reward is now directed to be offered and posted, as herein directed."

"DONE AT FRANKFORT, KENTUCKY, this, the fifth, day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and in the year of this Commonwealth the one hundred and forty-fourth."

EXECUTIVE ORDER

September 6, 1935  
(Soldiers to Harlan)

Governor Ruby Laffoon this day filed an executive order, which is ordered to be entered on the Executive Journal, and which order is in words and figures as follows:

EXECUTIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, it is well known to me, the undersigned Governor of Kentucky, that conditions of unrest and lawlessness now exist in Harlan County and have so existed for a long period of time; that a number of men have been beaten, bruised and seriously wounded; that houses have been dynamited, homes shot into, lives of citizens and officials sacrificed, and that in fact, a reign of terror now exists in said County and has so existed for some months, and

It further appearing that on September 4th, the cowardly assassination of County Attorney, Honorable Elmon Middleton, was committed in the very heart of the city of Harlan and that said assassination was committed because of the fact that said County Attorney was endeavoring to do his duty as a fearless County official should, and to bring to the attention of the Grand Jury, certain facts in regard to violations of the laws of Kentucky which he knew had been perpetrated in Harlan County, and

Whereas, it has been reported to me by representatives of both the Democratic and Republican Parties, that a reign of lawlessness now exists in Harlan County, and that the lives of its citizens and certain officials are in jeopardy, it further having been reported to me, in the event the real assassins of Elmon Middleton are apprehended, that the vengeance of the people will take effect in mob violence, whether the assassins are placed in the jail of Harlan County or of any other County in the State, and

Whereas, it has further been reported from statements by Circuit Judge Gilbert and others that "There has been for a number of years in Harlan County, a disregard of the laws which is not equaled by any County in the State, and that this reign of lawlessness has prevailed in Harlan County so long that it is even difficult to get Jurymen wholly free from sympathy with such law violations".

I, therefore, as Governor of Kentucky, in order that the lives, constitutional rights and property of Harlan County citizens may be properly safeguarded and protected do hereby order the Adjutant General of Kentucky, Henry H. Denhardt, and all the National Guard of Kentucky or so much thereof as the said Adjutant General by military order may direct on active duty. The said Denhardt will call all or such part of the National Guard as he may deem necessary to be assembled, and they will proceed into Harlan County for the purpose of preserving peace and order in Harlan County and maintaining the supremacy of the law therein.

There must be no interference with the right of any legal Democratic voter to cast his or her ballot as he or she prefers in the approaching primary election. The Adjutant General and troops under his command are ordered and authorized to use such force as may to him or them seem reasonably necessary to attain these ends, and may in said County enforce the laws of this Commonwealth.

"KENTUCKY RIVER BRIDGE"-FRANKFORT.

The Governor, the Honorable Ruby Larroon, this day issued an Executive Order, by which Order he directs that a new and modern Bridge shall be built over the Kentucky River at Frankfort at once, and that it be built at the point where the old bridge now stands, on St. Claire and Bridge Streets. And the State Highway Commission is directed to make at once all necessary surveys, plans and specifications for the construction of the bridge, and to do all things reasonably necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of the Act of the General Assembly of Kentucky, Chapter 159 of the Acts of 1934, and to proceed at once in the premises. It is further stated that the Governor requested the Highway Commission to make application to Hon. George H. Sager, Jr., acting State Director, Public Works Administration, for the payment or .45% of the total cost of the construction of the bridge by the P. W. A., and that he, in person, submitted the application to the Acting State Director, and that the allotment will be made.

REQUISITION TO MICHIGAN

The Governor made requisition of the Governor of Michigan for the return to Kentucky of LOVE KEEN, to answer an indictment in Clinton Circuit Court, for deserting his 16 year old child, etc. O A Cumming is appointed agent for Kentucky, to receive said Keen and conduct him to the jail of Clinto County.

H. Denhardt as aforesaid from the charges as above alleged in said indictment; and further forever acquits, releases and discharges said H H Denhardt from any offense or offenses crime or crimes that may in the future be charged against the said Denhardt in any indictment or indictments that may hereafter be returned by any grand jury of either Harlan or any other County in Kentucky or by any warrant or warrants that may be issued against him in any Court in Harlan or any other County in Kentucky based upon any action taken by the said Denhardt as a Military Officer acting in pursuance of duty under any orders heretofore issued by the undersigned, "Governor of Kentucky."

PARDON OF INDICTMENT NO. M-367.

The Governor this day granted unto HENRY H. DENHARDT a remission of the PENALTY and a PARDON of the OFFENSE as specifically alleged and contained in Indictment No. "M-367", which was returned by the Grand Jury of the Harlan Circuit Court, at its regular August term, 1935, charging said H H Denhardt with the offense of Criminal Contempt of the Harlan Circuit Court; and the Governor further remitted the penalty or penalties and pardoned the offense or offenses that may at any time be alleged or charged to have been committed by the said H H Denhardt while acting under the Military orders of the Governor, either by indictment or indictments that may be returned by any Grand Jury, or warrant or warrants that may be issued by any Court against the said H H Denhardt either in the County of Harlan, or in the County of Bell; and the Governor further acquits, releases and discharges the said H H Denhardt as aforesaid from the charge of Criminal Contempt as above alleged in said indictment, and the Governor further acquits, releases and discharges said H H Denhardt from any offense or offenses, crime or crimes that may in the future be charged against the said Denhardt in any indictment or indictments that may hereafter be returned by any Grand Jury of either Harlan or Bell Counties or by any warrant or warrants that may be issued against him in any Court in either of the said Counties based upon any action taken by the said Denhardt as a Military Officer acting in pursuance of duty under any order heretofore issued by the "undersigned, Governor of Kentucky."

RESTORATION TO CITIZENSHIP.

Be it remembered that heretofore, to-wit: On the 4th day of April, 1935, the Governor issued and signed an order granting the rights of citizenship to GREELEY LEE, of which rights said Lee had been deprived by reason of a judgment rendered in Clinton Circuit Court, at its Dec term, 1932, for possessing liquor illegally, -2nd. offense, and sentenced to a term of two years in the State Reformatory, which order the Governor withheld at the time, but which he has this day refiled and ordered to be entered in the Executive Journal.

P R O C L A M A T I O N
