Council on Public Higher Education; State Board of Education
Licensing of Institutions under KRS 164.945 to 164.947

WHEREAS, the Council on Public Higher Education by authority of KRS 164.945 to KRS 164.947 is empowered to create and develop standards and procedures for the licensing of colleges as defined in that statute, and

WHEREAS, the State Board of Education by authority of KRS 164.945 to 164.947 is empowered to adopt standards and procedures created by the Council on Public Higher Education for the licensing of colleges as defined in that statute; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Public Instruction by authority of KRS 164.945 to KRS 164.947 is empowered to issue licenses to all colleges as defined in that statute pursuant to regulations created and developed by the Council on Public Higher Education; and

WHEREAS, both the State Board of Education and the Council on Public Higher Education agree that the Council on Public Higher Education is the most appropriate body for both the development of standards and procedures for the licensing of such defined colleges, and the issuance of licenses to institutions affected by KRS 164.945 to 164.947.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WENDELL H. FORD, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by KRS 12.025(a), the function vested in the State Board of Education by KRS 164.945 to 164.947 to adopt and implement standards and procedures created by the Council on Public Higher Education for the licensing of such defined colleges shall be and is hereunder transferred to the Council on Public Higher Education; and the authority vested in the Superintendent of Public Instruction by KRS 164.945 to KRS 164.947 to issue all licenses to such defined colleges is transferred to the Executive Director of the Council on Public Higher Education who shall issue licenses pursuant to regulations promulgated by the Council on Public Education.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell H. Ford, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Sections 69 and 78 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and by the powers granted to me by Chapter 12 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, do hereby order and direct the following reorganization within the Department of Revenue effective September 1, 1974:

1. The Department of Revenue shall include the following:

- A. A Deputy Commissioner, appointed by and responsible to the Commissioner of Revenue, who shall assist the Commissioner in the fulfillment of his responsibilities;
 - B. A Legal Staff to be headed by a Director, appointed by and responsible to the Commissioner of Revenue;
 - C. A Research Staff to be headed by a Director, appointed by and responsible to the Commissioner of Revenue;
 - D. A Management Services Division to be headed by a Director, appointed by and responsible to the Commissioner of Revenue, which shall be responsible for budgeting, personnel Administration, and purchasing;
 - E. An Assistant Commissioner for Ad Valorem Tax, appointed by and responsible to the Commissioner of Revenue, who shall coordinate the functions of the following divisions, each to be headed by a Director appointed by the Commissioner of Revenue:
 - (1) A General Property Tax Division to include those general property tax functions previously performed by the Property and Inheritance Tax Division;
 - (2) A State Assessment and Inheritance Tax Division to include those state assessment and inheritance tax functions previously performed by the Property and Inheritance Tax Division;
 - F. An Assistant Commissioner for General Taxation, appointed by and responsible to the Commissioner of Revenue, who shall coordinate the functions of the following divisions, each to be headed by a Director appointed by the Commissioner of Revenue:
 - (1) An Income Division;
 - (2) A Sales and Severance Tax Division;
 - (3) A Selective Excise Tax Division;
 - (4) An Enforcement Division, which shall include those functions previously performed by the Field Division;
 - G. An Assistant Commissioner for Technical Services, appointed by and responsible to the Commissioner of Revenue, who shall coordinate the functions of the following divisions, each to be headed by a director appointed by the Commissioner of Revenue:
 - (1) An Accounting Division, which shall include those functions previously performed by the Records Division;
 - (2) A Data Processing Division.
2. The following units are hereby abolished:
- A. The position of Executive Assistant;
 - B. The Property and Inheritance Tax Division;
 - C. The Field Division;
 - D. The Records Division.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 74- 648-REORGANIZATION
DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE (CONTINUED)

3. The Commissioner of the Executive Department for Finance and Administration and the Commissioner of Personnel shall take all the necessary and required actions to implement the reorganization of the Department of Revenue pursuant to this Order.

4. All appointments made under this Order shall be subject to the provisions of KRS 12.050 and such appointees shall be major Assistants to the Commissioner and shall assist the Commissioner in the development of departmental policy.

Michael Joseph Hayes, on the 4th day of November, 1974, in U. S. District Court, Frankfort, Kentucky;

Gaylord Rankin Leet a/k/a Bruiser, Kentucky State Reformatory, LaGrange, Kentucky, to the U. S. Marshal for the Eastern District of Kentucky, for the purpose of testifying for the United States in the case of United States of America v. Jerald Hendricks, et al on the 11th day of November in U. S. District Court, Lexington, Kentucky.

These prisoners are to be released on condition that they be returned immediately after proceedings to the custody of Harold E. Black, Superintendent of the the aforesaid institution, and on further condition that all expenses of these transfers be paid by the United States of America. In no event shall surrender of these prisoners be construed as a complete relinquishment of jurisdiction by this Commonwealth.
