4. The Division of Industrial Development currently within the Department of Business Development is hereby abolished. All Funds, personnel, records, files, and equipment within the Director's Office and the Marketing Branch, both within the Division, are hereby transferred to the Office of Industrial Development, Office of the Secretary. All funds, personnel, records, files and equipment assigned to the Existing Industry Branch within the Division are assigned to the Division of Existing Industry created hereinabove.
