The Honorable Brereton C. Jones, having been duly elected Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky for a term of four (4) years beginning December 8, 1987, whereupon the said Brereton C. WHEREAS, the primary function of the Kentucky Revenue Cabinet is the assessment and collection of the myriad of taxes which compose the State General and Road Funds; and

WHEREAS, the Revenue Cabinet is also currently charged with projecting State General and Road Fund tax receipts in various statutorily required public submissions; and

WHEREAS, the Finance and Administration Cabinet is currently responsible for economic analysis necessary to manage State investments and debt in an efficient manner; and

WHEREAS, the transfer of revenue estimating functions from the Kentucky Revenue Cabinet to the Finance and Administration Cabinet would merge all economic analysis and forecasting functions in Finance, leaving Revenue free to focus on its essential tax collection functions;

WHEREAS, equal employment opportunity for all persons should be an integral part of any merit system, employment action, benefit, or condition of employment; and

WHEREAS, the continued implementation of an affirmative action plan and vigorous action which insures the quality and fairness to all is recognized to be the best interest of the Commonwealth;

(B) Provide such technical assistance as may be deemed appropriate to accomplish the purposes identified by the affirmative action plan;

(C) Provide through the Department of Personnel an annual analysis to insure that persons protected by anti-discrimination laws and regulations are not adversely affected by examination and selection procedures.

(D) Provide through the Department of Personnel for validation of examination procedures where practicable.

(E) Provide through the Department of Personnel for procedures to monitor in range appointments and salary adjustments to insure that standards are uniformly applied to prevent salary disparity.

5. The Commissioner of Personnel will report to the Office of the Governor semiannually regarding actions taken pursuant to the affirmative action plan. The plan shall thereafter be reviewed annually and necessary amendments will be recommended by the Commissioner of Personnel in consultation with other appropriate agencies;

WHEREAS, said final redesignation is based on a review of the comments submitted pursuant to 29 U.S.C. Section 1511(a) (3), and requests submitted pursuant to 29 U.S.C. Section 1511 (a) (4)

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WALLACE G. WILKINSON, GOVERNOR of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me pursuant to Public Law 97-300, codified as 29 U.S.C. 1511 (b), do hereby order and direct the following:

1. Service Delivery Area Structure

- A. There is hereby created 11 Service Delivery Areas within the Commonwealth of Ky.
- B. The 11 areas created will each:
  1. promote effective delivery of job training services; and
  2. is generally consistent with labor market areas or standard metropolitan areas, or
  3. is consistent with areas in which related services are provided under other State or Federal programs.

11. Organizations

A. The 11 Service Areas shall be organized as follows:

Service Delivery Area C consisting of the following county: Jefferson;

Service Delivery Area D consisting of the following counties: Bullitt, Henry, Oldham, Shelby, Spencer, and Trimble;

Service Delivery Area E consisting of the following counties: Boone, Campbell, Carroll, Gallatin, Grant, Kenton, Owen, and Pendleton;

Service Delivery Area F consisting of the following counties: Bath, Boyd, Bracken, Fleming, Greenup, Lewis, Mason, Montgomery, Robertson, and Rowan;
