1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? James M. Harp

2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. Harrod? Yes
- If so, how long have you known her? Fifty years
3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? Frankfort, Ky. 64 years
4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? Yes
5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage? Yes, I was at their wedding
6. How long did you know him? All his life
7. When and where did ~~Co. "E" 1st Ky Cavalry~~ John C. Harrod enlist in the war between the States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this? Company "E" 1st Ky Cavalry Lexington, Ky. I went through there with him

17. Do you know of your own knowledge that applicant is the lawful widow of Harrod? Yes I do.

18. Has she remained unmarried since her soldier husband's death, and is she now his widow? *I don't know if she did or not, I do know she is now the widow Mrs. Harrod.*

19. What property, effects or income has the applicant, if any, and how do you know this of your own knowledge? *None*

20. Has applicant conveyed any property, in the last two years or given any money, if so, what was it, and to whom? *No*

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.

BE IT KNOWN THAT WE JOHN C. HARROD AS PRINCIPAL AND AS SURETY
ARE JOINTLY AND SEVERALLY BOUND TO THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY
IN THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

THE CONDITION OF THIS BOND IS AS FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS, MARRIAGE IS INTENDED TO BE SOLEMNIZED BETWEEN THE
ABOVE BOUND JOHN C HARROD AND AMANDA GILMORE, NOW IF THERE IS NO
LAWFUL CAUSE TO OBSTRUCT SAID MARRIAGE, THIS BOND SHALL BE VOID:
OTHERWISE IT SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

The records show that J. Harrod, private, Captain J.A. Grant's Company, 3 (Butler's) Regiment Kentucky Cavalry, C.S.A., enlisted September 10, 1862 at Lexington, Ky. for 3 years. In March, 1863, by consolidation of organizations, the soldier became a private of Company E, 1 (Butler's) Regiment Kentucky Cavalry, C.S.A. On roll dated December 31, 1864, latest on file, and on prior rolls he was reported "Absent without leave since June 8, 1863 with General Morgan captured in Ohio." The roll dated April 30, 1863 reports him present.

The records further show that one John C. Harrod, private, Company A, Jesse's Battalion, Kentucky Mounted Riflemen, C.S.A., enlisted August 25, 1862 in Franklin County, Ky., aged 23 years, dark eyes, dark hair, dark complexion, height 6 feet, born in Franklin County, Ky., occupation farmer. He was captured at Pine Mountain, date not stated, and was exchanged September 17, 1862. By order dated September 29, 1863 the battalion was designated the 6 Battalion Confederate Cavalry, the soldier becoming a member of Company D. He was captured in Magoffin County, Ky., April 14, 1864, and was released at Camp Morton, Indiana, March 14, 1865 on taking the oath of allegiance to the United States.


