

Soldier's Application for Pension

I, William Henry Niett
am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Benton in the County of Marshall
in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Kentucky, in the war between
the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of
Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear
that I was a member of Third Ky. Infantry Volunteers
Company G
in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the
benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States,
and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and fam-
ily. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:



To Applicants for Pension

The material facts to be proven in the pension claim, under the laws of the State of Kentucky, are as follows:

1. Service in army.
2. Present Disability.
3. Indigency.
4. How you got out of the Army.
5. Character as a Soldier and Citizen.
6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filled out.

1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.
5. May be proven by comrades and citizens.

The records show that one W. H. Hiatt, private, Company G, 3d Kentucky Infantry, and Company G, 2d (Woodward's) Kentucky Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted July 22 (probably 1861). On the roll of the first mentioned company for July and August, 1863, last on which his name is borne, he was reported to have deserted June 14, 1863, at Vernon, Mississippi. His name is borne on the roll of Company G, 2d (Woodward's) Kentucky Cavalry, from August 1, 1862, to June 30, 1863, with remarks showing that he was enlisted as above stated and that he was present with that company, and he was also reported present on the roll of said company from July 1 to December 31, 1864, last on file.

The records of prisoners of war show that one W. H. Hiatt, a private of the 2d Kentucky Cavalry, Confederate States Army, voluntarily surrendered May 9, 1865, at Washington, Georgia, and was released May 22, 1865, at Nashville, Tennessee, upon taking the oath of allegiance.

A. Yes sir.

Q. How long have you known him?

A. Ever since I can recollect.

Q. Where does he live and how long has he so lived?

A. In Marshall County, all his life,

Q. How much land has he?

A. About 40 acres, worth about \$400.00 or \$500.00.

Q. How much personal property?

A. None.

Q. How much in your opinion is his annual income?

A. Nothing.

Q. What is his physical condition?

A. He is not able to work.

THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY.

WHEREAS J.T.Hiett has been appointed by the Marshall County Court Administrator of W.H.Hiett deceased, intestate.

Now We J.T.Hiett Administrator and J.M.Bean and A.A.Thompson sureties do hereby covenant to and with the COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY in the penal sum of Two Hundred Dollars that the said J.T.Hiett will well and truly administer the good, chattels, credits and effects of the intestate, according to law, and further make a just and true account of all his actings and doings therein; and will well and truly make a proper distribution of any surplus money, effects and rents which may come to his hands, or to any for him by color of his office, to the person entitled thereto. If it shall hereafter appear that a last will and testament was made by the deceased and the same be proved and recorded, we further covenant that the said J.T.Hiett will, in such case, surrender his letters of administration; and that he will account with, and pay and deliver over to the Executor or Administrator with the will annexed, the assets in his hands unadministered.
