- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.
Widow must have married prior to 1890.
To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.
Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.
Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.

HARRISON COUNTY COURT.

IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION
OF MRS. NANNIE ELLEN NICKELL
FOR STATE PENSION.

The application of Mrs. Nannie Ellen Nickell for State Pension under the Act of the General Assembly of Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pensions to disabled and indigent Confederate Soldiers, having been filed in the Harrison County Court on Oct. 23rd. 1920, and having laid over until Dec. 31st. 1920, a day of the regular December term 1920 of said Court, when the said Nannie Ellen Nickell appeared in open Court with W. T. McKee and Robt. Cason, as witnesses, and the said Nannie Ellen Nickell, W. T. McKee and Robt. Cason, having been sworn in open Court, testified as follows:

That the said Nannie Ellen Nickell is a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Harrison County, Kentucky; that she has been a resident of the State of Kentucky all of her life; that she is unable to earn a support by manual labor; that she is unable to earn a support by reason of her knowledge, art or skill in any profession, trade or craft; that she does not receive a pension from the United States, or any State or foreign Government; that she does not possess net income to the amount of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars per year; that she owns about \$500.00 worth of personal property; that her support is not suitably provided for or secured by reason of a contract or agreement for a valuable consideration with a person able to provide such support; and that the said Nannie Ellen Nickell is not able to obtain an income equivalent to \$300.00 per year by reason of her combined partial ability to earn a support and income; that the said Nannie Ellen Nickell is the widow of Andrew Thomas Nickell, to whom she was married in Harrison County, Kentucky, and that she has not married since the death of the said Andrew Thomas Nickell; that the said Andrew

Thomas Nickell served for more than one year as a Confederate Soldier in the war of 1861 to 1865.

That Wm. F. McKee and Robt. Cason are each a resident of Harrison County, Kentucky, and they are each reputable men and worthy of belief; That J. W. Boyd and R. M. Collier, the original witnesses to this application, are each a resident of Harrison County, Kentucky, and that they are each reputable men and worthy of belief.

That Hanson Peterson, County Attorney of Harrison County, Kentucky, was present and represented the Commonwealth at the hearing of the witnesses relative to this application in open Court.

The undersigned County Judge of Harrison County, Kentucky, therefore finds that the said Nannie Ellen Nickell is a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Harrison County, Kentucky; that she has been a resident of the State of Kentucky all of her life; that she is unable to earn a support by manual labor; that she is unable to earn a support by reason of her knowledge, art or skill in any profession, trade or craft; that she does not receive a pension from the United States, or any State, or foreign Government; that she has never resided out of this State; that she does not possess net income to the amount of \$300.00 per year; that she owns about \$500.00 worth of personal property; that her support is not provided for by contract with any person; that the said Nannie Ellen Nickell is not able to obtain an income equal to \$300.00 per year by reason of her age and physical condition; that the said Nannie Ellen Nickell is the widow of Andrew Thomas Nickell, deceased, who served for more than one year as a Confederate Soldier in the War of 1861 to 1865, and

that she has not remarried since the death of her said husband.

In view of the foregoing, the undersigned is of the opinion that the said Nannie Ellen Nickell is entitled to a pension under the Act of the General Assembly hereinbefore referred to.
