Questions for Applicant

Artie L. Warterfield, of said State and County, desiring to avail

herself of the pension allowed to Indigent Widows of Soldiers, General Assembly, approved March 18, 1914, hereby submits her proofs, and after being duly sworn true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follow:

1. What is your full name and where do you reside? (Give State, County and Postoffice.)
Artie L. Mathis Warterfield, Murray, Calloway County, Kentucky
2. How long and since when have you been a resident of this State? all life, 77 years.
3. When and where were you born and what was your maiden name? Born Dec. 3, 1844, in Calloway Co. Ky. Maiden name Artie L. Mathis.
4. When and where was your husband born—state his full name, and where were you and he married, and who performed the marriage ceremony. (A copy of the marriage license or affidavits of two or more persons who know when the applicant was married to her husband, must accompany the application) W. M. Warterfield, born in Calloway Co. Ky. May 23, 1840. Married in said county & state, Dec 23, 1863, by Rev. Dirrett Padgett. Marriage certif. lost when Court House burned in 1906.
5. When and where and in what Company and Regiment did your husband enlist or serve during the war between the States? We refer to record of W.M. Warterfield now on file in Pension office at Frankfort. He was a pensioner at his death.
6. How long did your husband serve in said Company and Regiment?
7. When and where did your husband's Company and Regiment surrender?
8. Was your husband present at the time and place when his Company and Regiment surrendered?
9. If not with his command at surrender, state clearly and specifically where he was, when he left command, for what cause and by what authority?
10. When and where did your husband die? In Murray, Calloway Co. Ky. Nov. 2, 1921.
11. At the time of your husband's death, were you living with him as his lawful wife? I was.
12. Have you married since the death of your soldier husband? No.
13. What property, real or personal, or income do you have or possess, and its gross value? I received a 1/5 int, (undivided) in the home property in Murray, Ky which is valued at about \$1000. Have no other property real or personal. Income from ~~my~~ interest aforesaid (net) will be about \$50. per year. Applicant has no other income from any source.
14. Have you a family? If so, who compose such family? Have three girls and one son. viz: Mrs. S. Galloway, Mrs. Dora Ward, Mrs. Ernest Ray, and Burnett Warterfield,
15. Name some friend, giving his name and postoffice address, who will be willing to have us write to him about your case if necessary Tim Roark, Murray, Ky, Route No. 3.

1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? M. B. Rowark

2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. Artie L. Watterfield?
If so, how long have you known her? Yes, have known her since she was a girl.
3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? lives in
Murray, Calloway Co. Ky, has lived here all her life.
4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? Yes.
5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage? I was. I was an
attendant at the wedding Dec 23, 1863. She was married by Rev. Durvill Pudgett
6. How long did you know him? For many years - 40 or 50.
7. When and where did _____ enlist in the war between the States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this?

How do you know all this? (State fully and clearly.)
15. When and where did W. M. Watterfield die?

16. Where did he reside at his death, and how long had he been a resident of Kentucky at his death?
Murray Calloway Co. Ky, all his life.
17. Do you know of your own knowledge that applicant is the lawful widow of W. M. Watterfield?
Ans: I do. And they were living together at his death.

18. Has she remained unmarried since her soldier husband's death, and is she now his widow? Yes.

19. What property, effects or income has the applicant, if any, and how do you know this of your own knowledge?

I understand from reliable sources that she has nothing except a child's part (1/5) in the home in Murray, Ky.

Has applicant conveyed any property, in the last two years or given any away, if so, what was it, and to whom?

No. She had none to give.

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

-NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.


