Soldier's Application for Pension

I, James Price

am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Claysville in the County of Harrison

in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Kentucky, in the war between

the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear

that I was a member of Company "A" of Major Orville Cameron's Ky

Battalion of Mounted Riflemen

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the

benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States,

and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and fam-

ily. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:

HARRISON COUNTY COURT.

In the matter of the application of James Price for State Pension.

The application of James Price, for Pension under the Act of The General Assembly of Kentucky, entitled "An act granting Pensions to disabled and indigent Confederate Soldiers" having been filed in The Harrison County Court on December 22nd. 1913, the first day of the regular December Term, of said Court, and having laid over until January 26th. 1914, the first day of the Regular January Term of said Court, the said James Price appeared in open Court with Robert Beckett, and C. T. Clark, as witnesses and the said James Price Robert H. Beckett, and C. T. Clark, having been sworn in open Court testified substantially as follows: That the said James Price, is a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Claysville Harrison County Kentucky, That he has been a resident of the State of Kentucky all his life. that he is unable to earn a support by manual labor, that he is unable to earn a support by reason of his knowledge, art or skill, in any profession trade or craft, that he does not receive a pension from the United States, or any State, or Foreign Government, that he has never resided out of this State or been absent therefrom, except during the time of his service in the war; that he does not possess a net income to the amount of three hundred dollars per year, or any other amount, that he has no property of any kind except Two (2) old mares worth about Fifty (\$50) Dollars, he is a widower, his wife died several years ago, that the support of the said James Price is not suitably provided for, or secured by reason of a contract, or agreement, for a valuable consideration, with a person able to provide such support and that he has no such contract, or agreement with any person, or persons, for the support, either in whole, or part, and that the said James Price is not able to obtain an income equivalent to \$300.00 per year. by reason of his combined partial ability, to earn a support and income, or property or any, or all of them combined.

That the said Robert H. Beckett, and C. T. Clark, are each a resident of Harrison County Ky., and that they are each respectable men, and worthy of belief, that Dr. W. H. Carr, John R. Pope, and A. J. Huls, the original witnesses relative to this application are

each respectable men and worthy of belief.

That M. G. Land County Attorney, of Harrison County Kentucky, was present and represented the Commonwealth at the hearing of the witnesses relative to this application in open Court on January 26th 1914.

The undersigned County Judge of Harrison County Kentucky, therefore finds that the said James Price is a citizen of the United States and a resident of Claysville Harrison County Kentucky, that he has been a resident of the State of Kentucky all of his life, that he is unable to earn a support by manual labor that he is unable to earn a support by reason of his knowledge art or skill in any profession, trade or craft, that he does not receive a pension from the United States or any State or Foreign Government, that he has never resided out of this State or been absent therefrom, except during the time of his service in the war, that he does not possess net income to the amount of Three Hundred \$(300,00) Dollars per year, that he has no property of any kind, except Two (2) old mares worth about Fifty (\$50) Dollars. That the support of James Price is not suitably provided for or secured by reason of a contract. or agreement for a valuable consideration with a person able to provide such support and that he has no such contract or agreement with any person or persons, for his support either in whole or part, and that the said James Price is not able to obtain an income equivalent to \$300 per year, by reason of his combined partial ability to earn a support and income or property or any or all of these combined.

In view of the foregoing the undersigned is of the opinion that the said James Price, is entitled to a pension and the benefit under the act of The General Assembly hereinbefore referred to, and he therefore recommends the granting of the pension to the said James Price under said Act.
