- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
- 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
- 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
- 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
- 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
- 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.

The records show that John H. Moreland, private, Company D, 2d (Duke's) Kentucky Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted July 1, 1862; that he was captured at Providence, Indiana (date not shown); was paroled at Camp Douglas, Illinois, February 13, 1865, and sent to Point Lookout, Maryland, for exchange, and was received at Boulware and Cox's Wharf, James River, February 20 and 21, 1865.

The prisoner of war records also show that one J. H. Moreland, private, 4th Kentucky Cavalry, Confederate States Army (name not found on the rolls of that organization, however), surrendered at Washington, Georgia, May 9, 1865, and was released at Nashville, Tennessee, May 22, 1865, upon taking the oath of allegiance.

stated in substance as follows, viz. / Ann Maria Moreland the claimant stated that she was married to the soldier John Moreland April 4th 1867 in Daviess County Ky, -" she did not know him while he was in the service, but that he did serve in Company D, 2nd Regiment Ky, Vol Cav in the war between the states, this of course he told me, and I have heard him talk with other about it and I am sure that the man I married- (His name was John H. Moreland)- and he served as John Moreland--

His Captain was John B. Castleman in Morgans Cavalry, he was in prison was captured with General- John H. Morgan.

I have no property except a farm very poor land and badly washed I think it ough to be worth \$900.00 we did not pay that much for it but land has come up some. I have no income of any sort from any other source except from the farm which cannot be cultivated only a small portion of it, the only good land there is drowes out water comes down from the hill and ruins crops on that bstter part almost every year, I have a cow and raise some chickens and sell butter and a few chickens, I have three children all married and doing for themselves they are all poor, I have no one to look to for support, nor any contract with any one to take care of and support me, I live along one of my Grand-children is with me now.

My husband was born in Shelby County Ky, his full name is-" John Holland Moreland, I understand he enlisted as John Moreland, I have the Certificate of his service my Lawyer sent and got for me this gives his name as John Moreland,

He died April 26th 1912 in Daviess county, he had lived in Daviess County, this county ever since before we were married in 1867, he had no Insurance on his life.

P. P. Moreland stated his address is Helm and Letcher streets No. 1322 Henderson, Henderson County Ky and that he is 76 years old, soldier was my Brother, younger than I, I was present when he enlisted in June or July 1862, I wanted to enlist myself but my hearing was bad and they did not want me because I could not hear I saw him enlist, saw him in uniform, and with my his arms, he came home to see Mother once before he went south and also came there once when with Morgan came through Kentucky and I know he was there- he got captured when Morgan was captured and he was sent to Camp Douglass, I sent him Money and clothes while he was in prison, then he got exchanged and went back to fighting he was parolled in May 1865, I think in North Carolina, I may however be mistaken in this, it might have been in Georgia he was parolled but I know that he was regularly enlisted and sworn in in June or July 1862 in Colonel John B. Castleman Company D, 2nd Regiment Ky Vol, Cav, served under Morgan, captured with Morgan exchanged and surrendered and came home in May 1865- his name was John Holland Moreland. His name is John Moreland

His name is enrolled as John Moreland-" John Moreland"- .
 When he was married he gave his middle initial, " John H. Moreland and I know positively that the John H. Moreland to whom this claimant Ann Maria Moreland, her name was, Miss Ann Maria Riddle prior to her marriage to soldier, and her husband John H. Moreland to whom she was married April 4th 1867 was the same and identical Moreland who served as John Moreland in Co, D 2nd Regiment Ky, vol, Cav C-S.A. in the Civil war 1862 to 1865- My Post-Office Address is No, 1322 Helm & Letcher streets Henderson Ky.

Also is filed the Certificate of service service of John Moreland as of Co, D, 2nd Regiment Ky Vol, cav, John B. Castleman Captain of Co, D, Morrisons Cavalry

and affidavits of Charles Riddle and Witt Riddle affidavits as to value of as to value of land and property owned by claimant-

And affidavit of P. B. Moreland filed herewith these affidavits were filed prior to trial, and said witness was present in court and testified as above stated in open court.

The applicant Ann Maria Moreland having been proven to be widow of John Moreland who was in the confederate service, and that she is indigent as contemplated as provided in the Act approved March 11th 1912, granting pensions to confederate soldiers and widows of such as have died.

I therefore recommend that applicant Ann, Maria Moreland be granted a pension as provided in said Act.
