1. What is your full name and where do you reside? (Give State, County and Postoffice.) *Arie Mosgrove, reside at Locust, Ky., Carroll County, - my post office is Milton, Ky., R.R. #2*
2. How long and since when have you been a resident of this State? *For the last 42 years*
3. When and where were you born and what was your maiden name? *Born in Carroll County, Ky., January 22, 1870. Maiden name was Arie Dunaway*
4. When and where was your husband born—state his full name, and where were you and he married, and who performed the marriage ceremony. (If possible, attach certified copy marriage license in every case.) *Born in Louisville, Ky., Aug. 18, 1844. George D. Mosgrove. We were married in Madison, Ind., August 4th, 1887.*
5. When and where and in what Company and Regiment did your husband enlist or serve during the war between the States? *Enlisted in Carroll County, Ky., in September 1862 in Company F. H. Kentucky.*
6. How long did your husband serve in said Company and Regiment? *Until close of the war*
7. When and where did your husband's Company and Regiment surrender? *Mt. Sterling, Ky., in May 1865*
8. Was your husband present at the time and place when his Company and Regiment surrendered? *Yes*
9. If not with his command at surrender, state clearly and specifically where he was, when he left command, for what cause and by what authority? .....
10. When and where did your husband die? *Died in Carroll County, Ky., February 27, 1907*
11. At the time of your husband's death, were you living with him as his lawful wife? *Yes*
12. Have you married since the death of your soldier husband? *No*
13. What property, real or personal, or income do you have or possess, and its gross value? *One acre of land with a small house on it valued at \$100.*
14. Have you a family? If so, who compose such family? *Yes. Three children*
15. Name some friend, giving his name and postoffice address, who will be willing to have us write to him about your case if necessary. *Robert Long, Milton, Ky., R.R. #1.*

# Questions for Witnesses

1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? Price N. Demint, Carrollton, Ky.

James G. Guin, Carrollton, Ky.

2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. Anie Mosgrove

If so, how long have you known her? Yes since 1867

3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? Resides in Carroll County, Ky. has been a resident thereof for the last 40 yrs or longer

4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? Yes

5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage? No

6. How long did you know him? Since 1867

7. When and where did George D. Mosgrove enlist in the war between the States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this? Enlisted in Carroll County, Ky. in Sept. 1862 in Company F - 4th Kentucky - I belonged to same regiment

8. Were you a member of the same Company and Regiment at the close of the war? The same Regiment

9. How long did he perform regular military duty? From the time he enlisted until the close of the war

10. When and where was his Company and Regiment surrendered? Mt Sterling, Ky. in May 1865

11. Were you with the command when it surrendered? Yes

12. Was George D. Mosgrove, the husband of applicant, present?

14. When and where did he leave his command?

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
- 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
- 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
- 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
- 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
- 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

said application has been properly proven by witnesses whom I know to be reputable and entitled to  
credit; I as Judge of said Court, hereby recommend the allowance and payment of said pension, as pro-

vided by law, and so certify the same to the Adjutant General of the State of Kentucky.
