- 6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filled out.

- 1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
- 2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
- 3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
- 4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.

This claim is recommended.

W.C.RAY, after being duly sworn states that he has known the applie  
can for at least 60 years all the time a citizen of this county, that he  
did own a tract of 143 acres of land but same was under mortgage and  
foreclosed and land sold this day bring not more that \$700 or \$800. more  
than the indebtedness, that he has no other income and could not labor  
for his support being a woodenlegged man &c.

M.T.SHELBOURNE, after being sworn staes that he has known the appli-  
cant for 60 years as a resident of this county and state, that he is an  
honorable citizen and has nothing left afater the sale of his land except  
perhaps something like \$500. that he is old infirm veteran and unable to  
work having lost a leg, and that he has no income from any source.
