1. What is your full name and where do you reside? (Give State, County and Postoffice.) *Maggie Marrs Kentucky, Floyd County, Prestonsburg Ky.*
2. How long and since when have you been a resident of this State? *All my life.*
3. When and where were you born and what was your maiden name? *Born May 13, 1841 in Prestonsburg Ky. Maggie Ford*
4. When and where was your husband born—state his full name, and where were you and he married, and who performed the marriage ceremony. (If possible, attach certified copy marriage license in every case.) *Born in Pike County, Ky. on July 30, 1840. Samuel R. Marrs, married at Prestonsburg Ky. at Residence of Thomas Ford, Rev. William Keith*
5. When and where and in what Company and Regiment did your husband enlist or serve during the war between the States? *Enlisted at Paducah Ky. 10th Kentucky Cavalry Co. A.*
6. How long did your husband serve in said Company and Regiment? *About 4 years, all the war.*
7. When and where did your husband's Company and Regiment surrender? *Near Big Springs about 15 miles from Richmond, Va. on the day of Gen Lee's surrender at Appomattox.*
8. Was your husband present at the time and place when his Company and Regiment surrendered? *Yes*
9. If not with his command at surrender, state clearly and specifically where he was, when he left command, for what cause and by what authority?
10. When and where did your husband die? *May 11th 1892 at Prestonsburg Ky.*
11. At the time of your husband's death, were you living with him as his lawful wife? *Yes*
12. Have you married since the death of your soldier husband? *No.*
13. What property, real or personal, or income do you have or possess, and its gross value? *None*
14. Have you a family? If so, who compose such family? *None*
15. Name some friend, giving his name and postoffice address, who will be willing to have us write to him about your case if necessary. *Joseph M. Davidson Prestonsburg Ky.*

been presented as a witness in support of the application of Mrs. Maggie Marris for a pension under Confederate Pension Law, approved March 11, 1912, after being duly sworn, true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? William Hubbard, Woods Ky.
Thomas Burchett, Prestonsburg Ky.
2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. Maggie Marris? Yes.
If so, how long have you known her? 40 years or more
3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? Prestonsburg Ky. been a resident at Prestonsburg ever since I have known her
4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? Yes
5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage? I was not
6. How long did you know him? I served with him 4 years in the army and knew him till his death
7. When and where did he enlist in the war between the States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this? he In Pike County at Bellville Co. A. Tenth Ky. Cavalry. I was in same Co and served through the war.
8. Were you a member of the same Company and Regiment at the close of the war? Yes.
9. How long did he perform regular military duty? About 4 years till close of war
10. When and where was his Company and Regiment surrendered? Near Richmond Va.
11. Were you with the command when it surrendered? Yes
12. Was Samuel R Marris, the husband of applicant, present? Yes
13. If not present, where was he?
14. When and where did he leave his command? At place of surrendered the day Lee surrendered
For what cause? Gen. Lee had surrendered to Grant at Appomattox
By whose authority did he leave? Gen. John M. Elliott notified Gen. Eckles of Lee's surrender. then we all returned home. We were on our march to re-inforce Gen. Lee.
How do you know all this? (State fully and clearly.) I was in same company with Samuel R Marris, through all the war. Knew him well and know all about his service. Lived a close neighbor after the war and often discussed our service together. I also knew John M. Elliott after the war. He was a member of the Confederate Congress.
15. When and where did he die? he Prestonsburg Ky. in May 1892
16. Where did he reside at his death, and how long had he been a resident of Kentucky at his death? At Prestonsburg Ky. and had resided there since the close of the war.
17. Do you know of your own knowledge that applicant is the lawful widow of Samuel R Marris?

18. Has she remained unmarried since her soldier husband's death, and is she now his widow? *Yes*

19. What property, effects or income has the applicant, if any, and how do you know this of your own knowledge?
None that I know of. I have personal knowledge. Live a close neighbor

Has applicant conveyed any property, in the last two years or given any away, if so, what was it, and to whom?
None that I know of

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
- 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
- 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
- 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
- 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
- 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.


The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.


Now what I would like to know is, if
