Questions for Applicant

Jane Beckulhimer of said State and County, desiring to avail herself of the pension allowed to Indigent Widows of Soldiers, General Assembly, approved March 11, 1912, hereby submits her proofs, and after being duly sworn true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your full name and where do you reside? (Give State, County and Postoffice.)

Jane Beckulhimer, Florrass, Morgan County, Kentucky

2. How long and since when have you been a resident of this State? Since my birth June 12th 1849

3. When and where were you born and what was your maiden name? In Floyd County, Ky., June 12th 1849, Jane Dawson

4. When and where was your husband born—state his full name, and where were you and he married, and who performed the marriage ceremony. (If possible, attach certified copy marriage license in every case.) I became acquainted with him when he was a little boy in Floyd County, Ky. he was born about 1840, his name was Henry Paris Beckulhimer, we were married in Floyd County, Ky. Preacher Benny Porter, performed marriage ceremony.

5. When and where and in what Company and Regiment did your husband enlist or serve during the war between the States? Enlisted from Virginia, Richmond, Company D, 2nd Virginia Regiment Infantry, in year 1863

6. How long did your husband serve in said Company and Regiment? More than 2 years until close of the war.

7. When and where did your husband's Company and Regiment surrender? Under Gen. Lee, at close of war at Appomattox Station, Virginia

8. Was your husband present at the time and place when his Company and Regiment surrendered? Yes

9. If not with his command at surrender, state clearly and specifically where he was, when he left command, for what cause and by what authority? Was present with his Company & Regiment

10. When and where did your husband die? He disappeared from home May 2nd 1895 - 17 years ago, do not know where he is, unless could hear of him after he left - don't know whether he is dead or alive - think he is dead.

11. At the time of your husband's death, were you living with him as his lawful wife? Yes

12. Have you married since the death of your soldier husband? No

13. What property, real or personal, or income do you have or possess, and its gross value?

One cow - worth \$25⁰⁰

14. Have you a family? If so, who compose such family?

Two boys & one girl

1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? John C. Pack, Florrest, Ky.
2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. Jane Bickulhimer?
If so, how long have you known her? Yes, known her about 30 yrs. as resident of Morgan County
3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? Resides at Florrest Morgan County, Ky, has lived in Morgan County about 30 yrs.
4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? Yes Sir
5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage?
6. How long did you know him? Ever since 1863
7. When and where did Henry Paris Bickulhimer enlist in the war between the States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this? He enlisted about Richmond, Virginia, in 1863 in Company "D" 29th Virginia Reg. Infantry, he was in my company
8. Were you a member of the same Company and Regiment at the close of the war? Yes Sir we were members of same company and Regiment at close of war
9. How long did he perform regular military duty? For more than 2 yrs till close of war
10. When and where was his Company and Regiment surrendered? Near Hanover Station Virginia
11. Were you with the command when it surrendered? Yes Sir
12. Was ~~Paris~~ Henry Paris Bickulhimer, the husband of applicant, present? Yes Sir
13. If not present, where was he?
14. When and where did he leave his command? Hanover Station Va, where Lee surrendered
For what cause? Lee surrendered, war was over
By whose authority did he leave? By Gen. Lee's Authority
How do you know all this? (State fully and clearly.) I know these things because I was present in said Co & Reg. & Henry Bickulhimer was present in said Co & Reg.
15. When and where did Henry Paris Bickulhimer die? Do not know, he left his wife & large family one day about 17 yrs ago, said he was go out to buy logs, he never came back home - witness the end of them - don't know what became of him, think he is dead
16. Where did he reside at his death, and how long had he been a resident of Kentucky at his death? Florrest, Ky all his life - about 59 yrs at the year 1895
17. Do you know of your own knowledge that applicant is the lawful widow of

One cow worth \$25, no income, we have been neighbors for many years

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
- 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
- 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
- 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
- 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
- 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.

Memorandum fo Evidence.

D.H.Dawson under oath stated: " I know Jane Beckenheimer, She is my sister, and has been in Morgan County 27 years. She is the widow of Henry G. Beckenheimer. She has no estate of any kind. She has not heard from H.G. Beckenheimer for several years- 12 or 15. He had cancer of the stomach. She is living with her son and has no contract for support. He is just supporting her through sympathy. She has no income at all. She got about \$75 for the last little lot she sold. She has not heard from her husband for 12 or 15 years.

John C. Pack under oath stated: "I am acquainted with Jane Beckenheimer. I have known her 27 years, and knew her husband. HE was a soldier in the same company that I was in . I heard her say she had one cow. She has no estate. I don't reckon she draws any pension from the U.S. She lives with her son, and has nothing to pay him for her keep. Her son has nothing but a horse.

Finding of Fact.

I, I. C. Furgerson, Judge of the Morgan Co. Court, certify that D. H. Dawson of Floress, Ky. and John C. Pack of Floress, Ky. the above witnesses are honorable reputable citizens and worthy of belief, and from the evidence and from the Assessor's Books find that the above applicant, Jane Beckelheimer is the widow of Henry G. Beckelheimer, an old Confederate Soldier, who disappeared from home some 12 or 15 years ago, and now is most likely dead, and that she is now entitled to the pension under the indigent Rebel Soldier Pension Act of 1912.
