1. What is your full name and where do you reside? (Give State, County and Postoffice.)
Mrs. Ada Howard Williams Greene-663-Edmore Park, Lexington Ky.
2. How long and since when have you been a resident of this State? 62 years-all my life
3. When and where were you born and what was your maiden name? Warsaw, Ky. Aug. 26-1850.
..... Ada Howard (at time of marriage was widow of Williams)
4. When and where was your husband born—state his full name, and where were you and he married, and who performed the marriage ceremony. (If possible, attach certified copy marriage license in every case.) Grant Co. Ky.
Aug 8-1842 - John Wm Greene - was married Oct 15-1884
Certified Copy of marriage certificate attached hereto
5. When and where and in what Company and Regiment did your husband enlist or serve during the war between the States? In Company E - Fifth Ky. Infantry
6. How long did your husband serve in said Company and Regiment? Until Aug 31-1864. was wounded but was connected with Regiment to the close of the war.
7. When and where did your husband's Company and Regiment surrender? Surrendered at the close of the war, stayed after the close of the war in Perry Co. Ala.
8. Was your husband present at the time and place when his Company and Regiment surrendered? Was in hospital
9. If not with his command at surrender, state clearly and specifically where he was, when he left command, for what cause and by what authority? He was seriously wounded at battle of Jonesboro, Ga. Aug 31-1864 - unable to go further with his Company. Was 2nd Lieut.
10. When and where did your husband die? At Owenton, Ky. May 11-1901
11. At the time of your husband's death, were you living with him as his lawful wife? Yes
12. Have you married since the death of your soldier husband? No
13. What property, real or personal, or income do you have or possess, and its gross value? None
14. Have you a family? If so, who compose such family? Yes - Maggie Greene - Mrs. Anna May Greene Wright - and John Howard Greene - aged 18.
15. Name some friend, giving his name and postoffice address, who will be willing to have us write to him about your case if necessary. Mr. John N. Douglass - Owenton - Ky.

Questions for Witnesses

....., of said State and County, having been presented as a witness in support of the application of Mrs. Ada W. Greene for a pension under Confederate Pension Law, approved March 11, 1912, after being duly sworn, true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? Gabriel R. Caldwell, Quenton, Ky., P. O. No. 1.
2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. Ada W. Greene? I am acquainted with her and have known her ever since she married Plev. John W. Greene about the year 1867.
3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? She resides at Lexington, Ky., and has been a resident of this state all her life.
4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? I was.
5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage? I was not present at the marriage but was at the reception on the evening of the wedding.
6. How long did you know him? I first got acquainted with John Wm Greene in 1867 and knew him until his death.
7. When and where did John Wm Greene enlist in the war between the States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this? He first came to us as a member of the 5th Ky. Infantry just before the battle of Chickamauga, and was in the same brigade with him until the battle of Jonesboro, Georgia, where he lost a leg, and was retired from the service on account of disability.
8. Were you a member of the same Company and Regiment at the close of the war? I was a member of the 4th Ky. Infantry in the same brigade.
9. How long did he perform regular military duty? About three years, but I get this from information but I know he served from the time of the battle of Chickamauga until the battle of Jonesboro, Georgia, which I think was about one year.
10. When and where was his Company and Regiment surrendered? At Washington, Georgia, in May, 1865, after the close of the war.
11. Were you with the command when it surrendered? I was.
12. Was John Wm Greene, the husband of applicant, present? He was not.
13. If not present, where was he? In the south on the retired list.
14. When and where did he leave his command? At Jonesboro, Georgia.
For what cause? Caused by loss of one of his legs in battle.
By whose authority did he leave? By the authority of his officers.
How do you know all this? (State fully and clearly.) By being present with him as heretofore set out.
15. When and where did John Wm Greene die? He died in Quenton, Queen Co., Ky. about 8 or 10 years ago.
16. Where did he reside at his death, and how long had he been a resident of Kentucky at his death? He resided at Quenton, Queen Co., Ky. and had been a resident of Queen Co., Ky. to my knowledge ever since 1867.
17. Do you know of your own knowledge that applicant is the lawful widow of John Wm Greene? I do.

18. Has she remained unmarried since her soldier husband's death, and is she now his widow? *She has remained unmarried ever since her husband's death, and she is now his widow.*

19. What property, effects or income has the applicant, if any, and how do you know this of your own knowledge? *So far as I have been able to learn she has nothing.*

Has applicant conveyed any property, in the last two years or given any away, if so, what was it, and to whom? *I have never heard of any such conveyance or gift.*

NOTE.—Let the witness who can answer the greatest number of the questions do so; then let the other witness state in the space below how much of the testimony of the first witness he concurs in, and whether or not he can answer any of the questions not answered by the first witness. *The witness, Duncan R. Burk says he was with the witness, Gabriel R. Caldwell, during the entire time he served in the Confederate States Army, and he concurs in all the testimony of the said Caldwell except that the witness, Burk, did not attend the said reception.*

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.



Substance of testimony.

My name is Ada W. Greene. I have been living in Lexington for three years last August. Before that I lived in Owen County, Kentucky. I lived there for twenty-six years. Have been living in the State of Kentucky all my life. I have no means of support and do not enjoy any pension whatever. Have no contract with any person or society to provide for my support. It is right hard for me to make a support for myself. I am not able to make as much as \$300.00 a year clear of expenses and have no property at all.

Next witness - Will D. Oldham.

I am an attorney of this City, and have been here for seventeen years. I know the applicant, Mrs. Ada W. Greene, and have known her for about three years. I knew of her family for over nine years. She is now living in Elsmere Park, Lexington, Kentucky. She has had a continuous residence in the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907. She does not own any property in Fayette County, but I can't answer beyond that. To my knowledge she does not own any. She has no means of support that I know of and has no fixed income.

Next witness - Martin Constantine.

I live in Lexington, Kentucky. I know Mrs. Ada Greene, and have known her for about thirty years. She has lived in Garrard and Owen Counties, in Kentucky, ever since I have known her, and has lived in the State of Kentucky during all of said time. She has no means of support that I know of, and does not own any property to my knowledge.
