Soldier's Application for Pension

I, J. B. Rowland

am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Ellet Oak in the County of Grove

in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Kentucky, in the war between the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear

that I was a member of Co. "C" 13th Ky. Cavalry

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and family. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:

In what County, State and year were you born?

Answer Calloway County Ky Nov 2nd 1842

When did you enlist and in what command? Give the names of the regimental and company officers under whom you served?

Answer Enlisted first in Ross' Command March 1864, transferred to News' Command in three months and served there until close. Enlisted on Clinch river. Weekly Co. Gen. Allcock was Capt.

How did you get out of the army, when and where?

Answer Was released about May 1st 1865, by permission and direction of Col News at Corinth Miss.

Were you ever in prison? If so, state what prison and when released.

4. How you got out of the Army.
5. Character as a Soldier and Citizen.
6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filed out.

1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.

Two witnesses testify that they served with him and that they served for more than a year and until the war ended. They do not tell the company and regiment, nor when nor how he got out of the army.

No record has been found of the enlistment, service, capture or parole of a man named J. B. Roland as a member of Company C, 13th Kentucky Cavalry, C.S.A.

The records show, however, that one J. B. Roland (surname also borne Rowland) served as a private of Company G, 7th Kentucky Mounted Infantry, C.S.A., and that he enlisted October 10, 1861, at Camp Burnett. On the muster roll for January and February, 1862, dated July 10, 1862, and last on file, he was reported present. No later record of him has been found, nor any connection between the organizations named.



In the matter of application for pension of J. B. Rowland, whose post office address is Fulton, Kentucky, R. F. D. No. 3, the court makes the following report of findings, viz: That the applicant is and has been a resident of the State of Kentucky all his life; he owns real estate in Calloway County, Kentucky, valued at \$900., and personal property to the amount of about \$50., his income will not amount to \$100. per year, he is physically unable to earn a reasonable support for himself, and has no arrangement with any one to support him, and does not now and has never received a pension from any State or Government.

Then came T. E. Burnham and W. D. Sigmon, of Fulton, Ky. R. F. D. No. 3, who after having been sworn, testified as follows, viz: "We are well acquainted with the applicant and know him to be a resident of this State, We are informed that he has a life interest in some real estate in Calloway County but do not know the value of same, he owns personal property worth about \$50. and has no income to our knowledge except about \$100. per year which he earns doing farm labor and he is not able to earn his support.

Then came W. L. Roland of Fulton R. F. D. No. 3, and testified that he is familiar with the real estate owned by the said J. B. Roland, in Calloway County, Ky., which is a life interest in 10/11 interest in 100 acres, the whole value of which is not over \$1000.

Wherefore in view of the foregoing facts it is the judgment of the court that said applicant should be granted a pension and the court so recommends.

Dear Sir:-

I am in receipt of yours of the 5th, and I have carefully examined your application and all the proof filed with it, and I find that there is no record in the war records of your enlistment and service in the army.

Two witnesses testified for you as to your military record and say they were with you when dismissed at Corinth, Miss. but they do not give the company and regiment to which you and they belonged, nor do they state when you was dismissed at Corinth, Miss. As there is no record of your enlistment and service it is necessary that the proof be made clear and plain as to your enlistment, the length of time you served, and where and when you got out of the army, and should be made by two or more persons who served with you and know the facts.

If you can get this proof, do so and forward to be filed with your application as early as you can.
