the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear

that I was a member of Company G 9th Tennessee

Regiment

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the

benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States,

and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and fam-

ily. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:

- 1. Service in army.
- 2. Present Disability.
- 3. Indigency.
- 4. How you got out of the Army.
- 5. Character as a Soldier and Citizen.
- 6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filed out.

- 1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
- 2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
- 3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
- 4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.
- 5. May be proven by comrades and citizens.

In the matter of application for pension of John Aleck Hicks,
whose post office address is Fulton, Kentucky, R. F. D. No. 3,
the court makes the following report of findings, viz:

That the said applicant has been a resident of Kentucky 40 years;
that he owns no property of any amount; that he has not disposed
of any property; that his income does not amount to \$300. per year
that he is not able to earn his support by reason of knowledge,
art or skill in any profession, trade or craft; that he does
not now and has never received a pension from the United States
Government or any State or Foreign Government.

Then came P. E. Grissom, whose Post office address is Pilot Oak,
Graves Co., Ky., and J. W. Pirtle, whose post office address is
Fulton, Ky., R. F. D. No 3, witnesses herein, who after having
been duly sworn testified as follows: That they have known
the applicant 20 and 40 years; that he is a resident of this
County and State; that he does not own property amounting in
value to \$2500. that his income does not amount to \$300. per year;
and that he is physically unable to labor and earn his support.
Wherefore in view of the foregoing facts it is the judgment of
the Court that said applicant should be granted a pension and
the court so recommends.
