- Note—1. Before any questions are answered the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
- 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
- 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
- 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
- 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
- 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.



Replying to yours of the 9th instant relative to the applications of Robert Markham, Simeon Spencer, and C. H. Moore, will say that the proof in the cases of the first two mentioned is complete and I have recommended that they be allowed by the Board when reached by them for consideration. The applications are being taken up systematically, and will all be passed upon just as soon as possible.

Relative to the application of C. H. Moore, there is no proof as to his military service either by record or comrades, and unless he can get the affidavits of two or more comrades who served with him to prove his enlistment, length of service, and how and when he got out of the army, his application will not be favorably passed upon when reached by the Board for final action. If he can get this proof he should send it in to be attached to the application.

I am in receipt of yours of the 1st. On January 13th last I wrote you a letter stating what proof you had, which was, that there was no proof of your enlistment or service in the army, and later you forwarded me the affidavit of S. S. Allen in which he testifies that he served with you for more than 5 months, and also the affidavit of Simeon Spencer, in which he says that he served with you during the war, but does not state when and how you got out of the army. It would be well if you would get affidavits stating definitely when and how you got out of the army.

The proof in the application of Simeon Spencer is complete and I have recommended its allowance and it will be allowed when reached by the Pension Board for consideration.
