- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.

The affiant, J.B. White, states that he is a resident of Irvine, Estill County, Kentucky; that he was a soldier in the Confederate Army during the last two years or more of the Civil war; that he was in the same Company and Regiment with Jackson Stone, who married Sallie A. Hall after the War.


That affiant's regiment was the second (2nd.) Kentucky Mounted infantry commanded by Col. Thomas Johnson of Montgomery County, Kentucky; that Capt. J.H. Bradshaw was his Captain and Richard Morton and Marion Hadden Lieutenants in said Company.

That said Jackson Stone served continuously in said Regiment and Company in the latter part of the War for two years or more, until the close of the War, and the operations of said command were generally in Southwest Virginia, East Tennessee and in the Shenandoah Valley, Virginia.

That nearly all of members of said Regiment and Company known to this affiant are now dead; that A.J. Wood, a soldier of said Regiment and Company resides in Oklahoma and is an applicant for a pension in that State, whose address may be obtained from the Commissioner of Pensions there, as affiant is informed.
