

Questions for Applicant

STATE OF KENTUCKY,

..... Quinn County.

..... Missouri Hammond of said State and County, desiring to avail herself of the pension allowed to Indigent Widows of Soldiers, General Assembly, approved March 11, 1912, hereby submits her proofs, and after being duly sworn true answers to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your full name and where do you reside? (Give State, County and Postoffice.) Missouri Hammond, East Cayle, Quinn Co., Ky.
2. How long and since when have you been a resident of this State? All my life.
3. When and where were you born and what was your maiden name? I was born in Scott Co., Ky., on the 13th day of March, 1842. My maiden name was Crown.
4. When and where was your husband born—state his full name, and where were you and he married, and who performed the marriage ceremony. (If possible, attach certified copy marriage license in every case.) My husband was born, on the 10th day of Nov. 1847. His full name was Jonathan Hammond. He was born in Quinn Co., Ky. I was married in Quinn Co., Ky., on the 10th day of Nov. 1866. The ceremony was performed by Elias Hudson.
5. When and where and in what Company and Regiment did your husband enlist or serve during the war between the States? He enlisted in Company E, 3rd Battalion of Kentucky Cavalry in the spring of 1862.
6. How long did your husband serve in said Company and Regiment? Until the close of the war.
7. When and where did your husband's Company and Regiment surrender? At Mt. Sterling, Ky., April 30, 1865.
8. Was your husband present at the time and place when his Company and Regiment surrendered? He was.
9. If not with his command at surrender, state clearly and specifically where he was, when he left command, for what cause and by what authority?
10. When and where did your husband die? He died in Quinn Co., Ky., on the 9th day of July, 1906.
11. At the time of your husband's death, were you living with him as his lawful wife? I was.
12. Have you married since the death of your soldier husband? No.
13. What property, real or personal, or income do you have or possess, and its gross value? I have 4.5 acres of land worth about \$3000. I have worth \$2000, and one cow worth \$300. I have 2 hogs worth \$60, and other things. About \$200 per year income.
14. Have you a family? If so, who compose such family? I have a family of four children but all of them are grown. My widowed daughter and one child, a girl about 13 years old, live with me.
15. Name some friend, giving his name and postoffice address, who will be willing to have us write to him about your case if necessary. J. M. Starnes, East Cayle, Quinn Co., Ky.

Questions for Witnesses

Howard Mason, of said State and County, having been presented as a witness in support of the application of Mrs. Missouri Hammund for a pension under Confederate Pension Law, approved March 11, 1912, after being duly sworn, true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? Howard Mason, East Eagle,
Quinn Co., Ky.
2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. Missouri Hammund?
If so, how long have you known her? I have known her about 50 years.
3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? She resides
in Quinn County, Ky., and has been here all her life.
4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? I was
5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage? No.
6. How long did you know him? For over 50 years
7. When and where did Jonathan Hammund enlist in the war between the States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this? He enlisted in Company
E, 3rd Battalion of Kentucky Cavalry of volunteers, under Capt. W. T. Harris & Lieut. C. D. Clark
in the spring of 1864. I was present when he enlisted, and he enlisted in my company.
8. Were you a member of the same Company and Regiment at the close of the war?
I was.
9. How long did he perform regular military duty? About one year and until the
close of the war.
10. When and where was his Company and Regiment surrendered? At Mt. Sterling, Ky., April
30th, 1865.
11. Were you with the command when it surrendered? I was
12. Was Jonathan Hammund, the husband of applicant, present?
He was.
13. If not present, where was he? He was present
14. When and where did he leave his command? Never left his command until captured
For what cause?
By whose authority did he leave? He surrendered by order of his Col., Capt. Clark.
- How do you know all this? (State fully and clearly.) I was present when Jonathan Hammund
joined the same company that I was a member of, and we
were in the same company together until we both surrendered at Chapman.
15. When and where did Jonathan Hammund die? He died
in Quinn County, Kentucky, about seven years ago.
16. Where did he reside at his death, and how long had he been a resident of Kentucky at his death? He resided in
Quinn County, Kentucky, at the time of his death, and he resided in
the said county and state all his life.
17. Do you know of your own knowledge that applicant is the lawful widow of Jonathan Hammund?
I do.

18. Has she remained unmarried since her soldier husband's death, and is she now his widow? *She has remained continuously a widow since her soldier husband's death, and she is now a widow.*

19. What property, effects or income has the applicant, if any, and how do you know this of your own knowledge? *She lives in my neighborhood and I have known her all her life. She has no property except one cow worth about \$30.00; I have with about \$35.00*

Has applicant conveyed any property, in the last two years or given any away, if so, what was it, and to whom? *She has neither conveyed any property nor given any away in the last two years nor at any other time.*

NOTE.—Let the witness who can answer the greatest number of the questions do so; then let the other witness state in the space below how much of the testimony of the first witness he concurs in, and whether or not he can answer any of the questions not answered by the first witness. *The witness Paschal Mason says he was in the company with the decedent, Jonathan Hammond, and with the witness Howard Mason, and he knows that all the statements of the witness Howard Mason are true and he concurs in all of them.*

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
- 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
- 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
- 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
- 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
- 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS.

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.

Soldiers or their widows, having been filed in this Court on or before the regular April, 1912, term and
lain over until this, a subsequent regular term thereof; the following is a brief memorandum of the sub-
stance of the testimony of each witness heard by me touching said claim:-

Witness:- George Jackson P. O. Owenton R. N. #1,
and J. L. W. Slaughter P. O. Owenton Ky.
Each testify that the applicant Misroui
Hammond is now, and has been for 25
years last part a resident of Owen County,
and is a widow of Jonathan Hammond
deceased; that she owns small farm
worth \$250⁰⁰/₂₄, and no personal property;
that by reason of old age and bodily
infirmity, is unable to earn living
by manual labor; net income does
not exceed \$50.00 a year; that she draws
no pension from ~~the~~ any State or
the Government of the United States

And I find from all the evidence adduced the following facts proven:-

That the applicant herein was the wife of Jonathan Hammond, who joined
the Confederate States Army in the Spring of 1864, and served continuously in said
Army until the war closed; that she married him in Logan County, Kentucky, on the
7th day of Nov., 1866; that she lived with him as his wife continuously until his
death which occurred on the 9th day of July, 1916; that she has never married a-
gain but is now his widow; that she is now and has continuously been
for more than 25 years last part a resident in and a citizen of Owen Co.,
Ky.; that she owns property of the value of \$250.00 and derives therefrom income
from same does not exceed \$50.00 per year; that she has no other source of means
whatsoever from charity; that she is unable to earn a sufficient by manual
labor, and derives no pension from any source whatever.

Wherefore upon the merits of the claim I recommend that the pension applied for by
