

Soldier's Application for Pension

I, W. A. Roland

am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Barlow in the County of Ballard

in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Tennessee, in the war between

the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear

that I was a member of Company "F" 11th Tennessee Regiment

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the

benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States,

and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and family.



I J.A.Himes, Judge of Ballard County Court hereby certify that in the matter of W.A.Roland applicant for a pension under the act of the General Assembly of Kentucky entitled " An Act granting Pensions to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers: and said application coming up for trial and the County Attorney being present, the Applicant introduced a person ~~who after being sworn~~ J.W.Meshe~~w~~ by name who is personally known by me to be a person worthy of credit: then and there being sworn by me states that he has known the said W.A.Roland for the last twenty five years; that he resides and has continuously in this, Ballard County for more than Seven Years last past: that he owns a house and lot situated in Barlow Kentucky, of the value of \$800.00 and has no other income that he knows of and his earning capacity would not be over \$100.00, per annum, either by ~~manu~~ labor or otherwise.

Also came W.L.Roland of Barlow Ballard County Kentucky personal known by me to be a person worthy of credit upon oath: who being first duly sworn by me states the following, that he has known the said W.A.Roland for the past 31 years: that he is a resident of this county and has been for more than seven years last past; that he has a house and lot in Barlow Kentucky of the value of \$800.00 to \$1000.00 and personal property to the amount of seven or eight hundred Dollars, that his earning capacity would not exceed \$100.00 per

I also further certify that J.W.Meshe~~w~~ is a Physician of good standing professionally and worthy of credit, he being duly licensed and practicing in this County for a number of years.

And now after hearing all the evidence submitted in this case and knowing the parties as I do I recommend that the applicant be allowed a pension as the law directs.
