The material facts to be proven in the pension claim, under the laws of the State of Kentucky, are as follows:

- 1. Service in army.
- 2. Present Disability.
- 3. Indigency.
- 4. How you got out of the Army.
- 5. Character as a Soldier and Citizen.
- 6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filled out.

- 1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
- 2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
- 3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
- 4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.
- 5. May be proven by comrades and citizens.

Sworn in open Court and examined by D. Gray Falconer, County Attorney.
Applicant was not present in Court, because of sickness.

Substance of testimony.

First witness - S. G. Vanderpool.

I reside at 725 Whitney Avenue, Lexington, Kentucky. I know the applicant, Stephen J. Brown. He is sick in bed, and is not able to be present in Court today. He lives at 232 Constitution Street in this City. I think he has been living in this City for about twelve years. He has always resided in the State of Kentucky. He does not own any property of any kind. He is married, but his wife does not own any property whatever. He has no income and does not draw any pension. He is not able to perform any manual labor whatever. He is about seventy-eight years of age.

Next witness - B. G. Vanderpool.

I live in Lexington, Kentucky, and know Mr. Stephen J. Brown. Have known him about fifteen or twenty years. He has been living in Garrard County, Kentucky, and in Lexington since I have known him, and lives in this City at the present time. He is not able to perform manual labor, and has no income that I know of. I do not think he has any contract with any person or society to provide for his support, and has no children or any one who can support him.
