Soldier's Application for Pension

I, Geo. Francis Page

am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Madisonville in the County of Hopkins

in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Kentucky, in the war between

the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear

that I was a member of Co. I 8th Ky. infantry

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and family. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:

In what County, State and year were you born?

Answer Hopkins Co. Ky. in the year 1844

When did you enlist and in what command? Give the names of the regimental and company officers under whom you served?

Answer In Oct. 1861. H. B. Lyon was Col. - Geo. Fowler Capt. - Geo. Couch 1st Lieut. & Walter Clement 2nd Lieut.

How did you get out of the army, when and where?

Answer At Christiansburg, Va., about 1st of May 1865 - by parole

Were you ever in prison? If so, state what prison and when released.

Answer yes. at Camp Douglas, Ill. Released in Feb. 1865 - Before that I was also in prison at Camp Morton

Were you paroled? If so, when and where?

Answer yes. as stated above. I was sent there for exchange from Camp Douglas

Did you take the oath of allegiance to the United States Government?

Answer yes. at Nashville Tenn. on my way home in May 1865 -

The records show that J. F. Page (name not found as John Francis Page), corporal, Company F (formerly Company I), 8th Kentucky Mounted Infantry, C.S.A., enlisted October 18, 1861, at Hopkinsville, Kentucky; was captured February 16, 1862, at Fort Donelson, and declared exchanged November 10, 1862, at Aikens Landing; was captured July 4, 1863, at Vicksburg, Mississippi, and paroled at that place July 6, 1863; was again captured December 17, 1864, near Nashville, Tennessee, paroled at Camp Douglas, Illinois, and transferred to Point Lookout, Maryland, for exchange, March 2, 1865, and was received at Boulware's and Cox's Wharves, James River, Virginia, March 10-12, 1865. His name appears as a signature to an oath of allegiance to United States sworn to at Nashville, Tennessee, May 5, 1865, on roll of rebel deserters at Nashville, Tennessee, to whom the oath of amnesty was administered, which shows that he deserted April 16, 1865.

John Francis Page.

This cause coming on to be heard the application herein of John Francis Page having been filed at the regular March 1915 term of this Court, on March 1st, 1915, and laid over until this term, came said applicant John Francis Page and introduced as witnesses in his behalf John H. Shaw and E. B. Welch who were duly sworn and testified in open court in substance: That said applicant now resides in Hopkins County Kentucky, that he has been a resident of Hopkins County Ky., for forty years past, that they are personally acquainted with the applicant and have known him for the past forty years, and said applicant now resides in Hopkins County, and has had a continuous residence in said County and State since the time named above with the exception of the time he was in the Confederate service, that he is unable to perform manual labor for his support and has no income other than the proceeds from a little farm which the affiant states is worth six or seven hundred dollars, and that the applicant's wife is dead, and that applicant owns no personalty except his household goods, and that the witnesses have no interest in the prosecution of this claim directly or indirectly, and that they are not related in any way to the applicant.
