

Soldier's Application for Pension

I, Harry Dollaside
am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Lower Greasy in the County of Johnson
in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Virginia, in the war between
the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear
that I was a member of Co. 7th Virginia Cavalry

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the
benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States,
and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and fam-
ily. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:

To Applicants for Pension

The material facts to be proven in the pension claim, under the laws of the State of Kentucky, are as follows:

1. Service in army.
2. Present Disability.
3. Indigency.
4. How you got out of the Army.
5. Character as a Soldier and Citizen.
6. Applications will not be filed unless certificates of Doctor and County Judge are filled out.

1. May be proven by officers or comrades.
2. May be proven by physician's certificate.
3. May be proven by neighbors and by certificate of County Judge.
4. May be proven by filing parole or discharge, or in case these have been lost or destroyed, by officers or comrades who know the facts.
5. May be proven by comrades and citizens.

I call your attention to the following Section of the Pension Law. The Certificate of the County Judge referred to therein must accompany your Voucher for the quarter ending November 1st.

“Sec. 13. Once each year every pensioner under this act shall furnish in addition to the usual voucher, a certificate from the County Judge of the county where he resides to the effect that he is the holder of the pension certificate, is the identical person to whom the same was issued, and that to the best of his belief there has occurred no changes in his financial condition which would render the pensioner ineligible to receive such pension.”

No blanks will be furnished for the use of the County Judge. His certificate must be made out by himself in his own language.

That he has been a residence of Johnson County since the year 1866; that he is unable to earn a support by manual labor; that he has no income; no property neither himself nor his wife; that he served in the Confederate army from 1861 to 1865; that he was not discharged but that the army he was with disbanded; that his support is not provided for by any contract; that he receives no pension from the Government of the United States nor from any foreign country; that he was born in 1846; enlisted in the Confederate army at first in Wise County, Virginia; he was serving under Prentice when disbanded.

VOUCHER

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICER BEFORE WHOM THIS VOUCHER IS EXECUTED.

1. This voucher may be executed before any officer authorized to administer an oath and having a seal.
2. In every case the pension certificate must be carefully compared with the voucher by the officer who executes it.
3. The officer will also see that post-office addresses are correctly inserted in the proper spaces in the voucher, particularly the address to which the check is to be mailed. He will also give his own postoffice address after his official title on the face of voucher.
4. The officer will be held strictly responsible for the correctness of his certificate of identity in every particular.
5. Vouchers must be returned to the pension Department, by February 1st, May 1st, August 1st, or November 1st, following the execution of the vouchers in order that checks may be paid promptly each quarter.

All acts involved in the execution or correction of vouchers must be performed in the presence of the officiating officer who must certify to the correctness over his own signature on the face of the voucher in the space indicated.
