Sam H. Little having been convicted on a charge of dynamiting fish and given a one-year sentence in the Breathitt Circuit Court and his appeal from said conviction having been affirmed by the Court of Appeals of Kentucky and the usual mandate of said Court to the Circuit Court having been issued, I, Keen Johnson, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 77 of the Constitution of Kentucky, do hereby order that the execution of said judgment be stayed for a period of thirty days from and after November 20, 1942, and the Judge of the Breathitt Circuit Court and the Sheriff of Breathitt County and all other officers are commanded to respect and give full force and effect to this order.

This stay of sentence is granted because the Barkelew Electric Manufacturing Company, of Middletown, Ohio, has requested that Little be permitted to continue in his present capacity until another employee can be trained to do the work now being performed by Mr. Little. I quote from the Barkelew Company's letter:

"The company is on a 100% War basis manufacturing electric switches for use on Navy ships and ships for the Maritime Commission. Our present War Production Board blanket priority rating is 65% AA-1 and 35% AA-4.

"As the labor situation in this vicinity is very bad, it would be practically impossible for us to hire a skilled man to take Mr. Little's place. In any event the training of an unskilled man would hinder our production and therefore be detrimental to our part in the War effort."

WHEREAS, the Court of Appeals of Kentucky did on _____ day of _____ 1942, rendered an opinion affirming the judgment of the Fayette Circuit Court; and,

WHEREAS, the said Robert H. Anderson, by his attorneys, presented to the Governor of this Commonwealth certain confessions made by Raymond Baxter and Thomas Penny which exonerated Robert H. Anderson of participating in the crime of which he, Robert H. Anderson was convicted; and,

WHEREAS, the said Robert H. Anderson has applied to the Governor of the Commonwealth for a stay of execution, and,

WHEREAS, the said Robert H. Anderson, by his attorneys, have requested sufficient time to fully investigate said statements and confessions made by Raymond Baxter and Thomas Penny:

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the power vested in him by the Constitution of the State, does hereby and now extend the time for the execution of the said Robert H. Anderson until Monday, January 22, 1943; and the Warden of the Penitentiary at Eddyville, Kentucky, and all Peace Officers of the Commonwealth will take due notice of this stay of execution and govern themselves accordingly.
