TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

WHEREAS, the assessment of property for taxation is known to be inequitable; and

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 21ST, 1949, CONTINUED.

WHEREAS, assessment is primarily a local responsibility and facilities and assistance should be provided local governmental units enabling them to give relief to the Citizens who have been paying more than their fair share of property tax and enabling them to improve their assessments so that property taxes may fairly bear that part of the local tax load which the citizens of each County, City, and school district demand that it should; and

WHEREAS, the method of distributing the educational equalization fund is unsound and under present law more than half of the school districts which received such aid this school year will not be eligible to receive it; and

WHEREAS, if a large number of school districts lose equalization aid, the educational systems of such districts will be impaired and the children will suffer without the taxpayers thereof having had adequate opportunity to put their own house in order; and

WHEREAS, it appears that funds are available in the State Treasury to provide relief to the State Mental Institutions in the way of additional appropriations for improving the care and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the present State law relating to the borrowing authority of rural electric cooperative corporations by limiting amortization of loans to twenty-five years, prevents the maximum benefits from loans made possible by federal laws authorizing the amortization in thirty-five years; and

WHEREAS, some question has been raised as to the validity and effect of Chapter 237 of the Acts of 1948, and it is essential that the policy of the State with respect to matters affecting lands and buildings of and for the State and its agencies be further clarified and declared;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, I, Earle C. Clements, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby issue this Proclamation convening the General Assembly of the Commonwealth in an Extraordinary session at the seat of Government in Frankfort, Kentucky, at 2:00 P. M., on Tuesday, March 1, 1949, for the following purposes and no other:

1. To consider and act upon legislation relating to the assessment of property for taxation and payment of property taxes and legislation correcting and improving the laws relating to the distribution of the common school equalization fund and the time of the adoption of school budgets and the time of the levy of school taxes, having in mind the relation these laws have to tax levy and assessment problems.

2. To consider and act upon legislation appropriating additional funds to the Department of Welfare for care of patients at and maintenance of State Mental institutions.

3. To consider and act upon such legislation as may be required to accomplish the purposes intended to be accomplished by Chapter 237 of the Acts of 1948, and further to clarify and declare the policy of the State with respect to the acquisition, ownership, operation, leasing, control, and disposition of

AMENDED CONTRACT-DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE  
AND

ROBERT B. HENSLEY, SPECIAL COUNSEL.

WHEREAS, pursuant to H. B. 475 enacted at the 1948 Regular session

of the General Assembly, Robert B. Hensley, of Louisville, Kentucky, was appointed on January 6, 1949, as Special Counsel for the Department of Revenue to act by and through the duly appointed and qualified Commissioner of Revenue, H. Clyde Reeves, in connection with the matters and on the terms and conditions set forth in the Contract dated January 6, 1949, and filed in the office of the Secretary of State; and,

WHEREAS, the executive order failed to specify the compensation which Robert B. Hensley would receive in those instances where a 20% penalty is collected under KRS 132.340 or in those instances where no penalty is collected;

NOW, THEREFORE, said written contract is amended by readopting and reaffirming each and every provision thereof except those contained in Section 6 thereof, which section is hereby amended to read as follows:

6. The Department of Revenue agrees to pay Robert B. Hensley three-Fourths of the twenty per cent penalty collected as provided by KRS 135.060 or KRS 132.340 pursuant to and as a result of any motion, suit, or other proceeding filed, instituted, prosecuted, or defended in any court of competent jurisdiction or before the Kentucky Tax Commission, by said Robert B. Hensley. Two-thirds of this amount (ten per cent) shall be paid from the Delinquent Tax Fund as provided by KRS 134.400, and one-third (five per cent) from the General Fund as provided by KRS 12.210 (1) which is and shall be the same as the one-fourth of the twenty per cent penalty collected and paid into the General Fund under KRS 134.400.

In those instances where Robert B. Hensley institutes or causes to be instituted in connection with the performance of his duties under this contract any suit, motion, action or proceeding in any court of competent jurisdiction or before the Kentucky Tax Commission resulting in the assessment of omitted property and/or the collection or payment of any taxes, penalties, interest, claims, demands, or judgments and a 20% Penalty is not applicable under either KRS 132.340 or KRS 135.060, Robert B. Hensley shall be paid a sum equal to 15% of the amount so collected, and said sum shall be paid from the General Fund.
